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
Flying concept of JOBY eVTOL

George Marrett Presents A Look Into The future Of The Daily Commute



For the last four years, Zach Reeder has been a test pilot for Joby Aviation. Prior to Joby Reeder, he was a test pilot and engineer at Scaled Composites, where he started working after graduating



from Texas A&M in 2005 with a BS in aerospace engineering. He is a commercial multi-engine instrument rated pilot, who has flown 42 different aircraft types.

Zach's first solo flight was in a hang glider that he designed and built for \$100. At Scaled, he currently flies the Firebird Demonstrator, Proteus, and Task Vantage, in addition to a Baron, Duchess, Extra 300, and L-39. Outside of work, Zach currently flies several types including his RV-8 (completed in 2010), Rutan's rec-

ord setting **Catbird** (Restored in 2011), and the family Super Cub back in East Texas. He spent several weeks in the spring of 2016 flying an AN-2 around northern Canada and Baffin Island. As an engineer and test pilot at Joby, Zach has significantly contributed to the design,



construction and flight test of the new eVTOL aircraft.


