The restoration shop wasn't as bad as originally thought and work is starting to progress, though slowly, on some of the aircraft. Damage estimates stand at around 4 million and will probably go higher. Sadly the most severely damaged aircraft was the Boeing model 100. The oldest Boeing in existence. Nearly all the wood will have to be replaced which means literally years in

On the positive side of all this is that Kermit was able to buy the Ford Tri-motor that many of us have seen at the Flying Lady museum up at south county. Although the fact that it was sold indicates that the museum is having financial problems of their own. This airplane will replace the one torn up in "Andrew" while (if) its being rebuilt. Fortunately one of the toughest problems in Tri-Motor restoration has been solved. Another Ford project has had dies made to produce the corrugated skin unique to that

aircraft and they are available to anyone needing them.

A particularly notewothy event has taken place in Canada recently. The finishing touches to a 21 year restoration have been applied and first flights have been made. The aircraft is The Fairey Swordfish belonging to Bob Spence of Ontario Canada. This aircraft served the British prior to and during the early days of WW 11 as a Carrier born torpedo bomber. A huge open cockpit three place (tandem) Bi-plane that was considered a relic in 1940. The Swordfish had a cruising speed of 110 mph and was a sitting duck for even the slowest of the German pursuits. In spite of these shortcomings the aircraft was instrumental in helping to sink the German Battleship Bismark. A torpedo from a Swordfish damaged the ships rudder which prevented her from maneuvering effectively, thus allowing the British Navy to come in and finish her off.

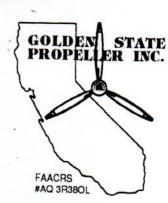
The Swordfish was a particularly difficult rebuild as virtually every part needed had to be hand made. Although there are a number of these aircraft in museums there are only (now) 2 flyable examples. One in England. The Santa Monica Museum also has a

fuselage of one hanging from the ceiling.

The Engine on this monster is the Bristol Pegasus radial which was

overhauled and installed by Mike Connors in Florida.

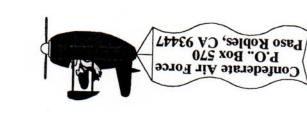
