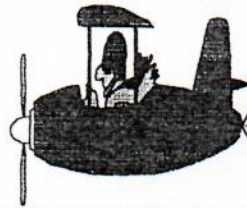

August Meeting

The next meeting will be held On Tuesday August 2, 1994 at the Hangar. Social Hour commencing at 6:00pm and Dinner at 7:00pm.

The program, as arranged by our versatile program chairman, George Marrett, will be provided by our own Fire Patrol group here on the Paso Airport. They will discuss many aspects of their job from aircraft fire control to types of suppressants and applications as well as a myriad of other points of interest. We see these guys staggering off the ground on a hot day with full loads but we have no real idea as to what it takes to do all this. It should be a most interesting program.

Staff Nominations

It is that time of the year again when we as a group must decide who will lead us for the coming 12 months. A nominating committee has been appointed composed of Bruce Toomey, Chairman, Keith Bowers, Glen Thomson, Obbie Atkinson and George Marrett.

The Squadron Staff is composed of 4 Administrative Officers and, generally, 7 additional members. It is the job of the Nominating Committee to seek out those interested in being on the Staff and making sure that they will agree to serve. A slate is then

presented to the membership at large for their approval.

Nominations have always been accepted from the floor and this will, of course, be continued. This year, however, the Nominating Committee would like to actively solicit inquiries from those who would be interested in serving on the Staff.

As a Committee we would like to see a broader spectrum of the membership become involved with the daily workings of the organization rather than giving the appearance that the Squadron is being run by a select few or a closed clique.

As is often the case, those few who generally volunteer for something, reluctantly or not, often get accused of wanting to "run things". In actuality, there is nothing in the world that those who have been serving for so long would rather see than new members coming forward.

Therefore, any of you who are interested, whether you are colonels or not, please let one of the committee members know of your interest. As the old saw goes, the only way to contribute or make changes in an organization is to get in there yourselves and make a difference.

A Recap of the CAF/Museum Question

At the June meeting there was a considerable amount of consternation and fairly heated rhetoric regarding the direction our organization would take during the ensuing years.

One of the major areas of concern was the fact that there was so little information available to the membership at large regarding the background of the problems that had come up with respect to the Squadron's relationship with CAF Headquarters. (HQ).

Let it be clearly stated up front that there never was and never has been any intent to keep our membership in the dark about any of these considerations. The so-called ultimatum from HQ was simply put aside for the moment because it came right in the middle of preparations for the air show and they did give us some time to consider it.

Since that time there have been several conversations with various HQ individuals as well as correspondence between HQ and the Squadron. Many of the early misunderstandings have been laid to rest and what we believe to be a considerable change in

attitude at HQ has made for some very reasonable recent discussions.

To try to put the record straight, the facts surrounding our initial efforts to become a part of the CAF and our subsequent actions are set forth as follows:

In 1989 a group of interested people asked the CAF for permission to establish a Squadron in the Paso Robles area. This request was duly accepted by HQ and a mountain of forms were sent as well as another mountain of rules and regulations. The forms were filled out and returned and we were then permitted to be a part of the national group known as the Confederate Air Force. While the rules and regulations were obviously available we were so busy getting established and looking for a home base that only a cursory glance was made in the direction of the By-laws etc.

This is not to place blame on anyone in any way. It is simply a fact that we (NONE of us) informed ourselves properly as to what was required of us as a unit of the CAF.

As time went on we began to be more and more successful and donations of equipment and other items were made to us as the Estrella Squadron of the Confederate Air Force. It eventually began to dawn on us that donations of equipment and other hard items probably /actually belonged to HQ according to the By-laws etc.

By this time we had a couple of air shows under our belt and were accumulating more and more stuff and a feeling was developing that perhaps we ought to have a method of keeping some of our goodies to ourselves rather than having them belong to the CAF or HQ. Consequently, the idea of a home-grown organization like the Warbirds Museum with local control began to sound pretty good. So, it was kind of generally accepted that the Museum idea was the way to go. Of course we didn't want to lose the name recognition of the CAF so it began to get a little squirmy as to just how this was going to work.

At this point we now had three entities, the Squadron which is a part of the CAF, the CAF itself as

represented by HQ and the Estrella Warbirds Museum which is NOT a part of the Squadron or the CAF.

During the year 1993, the money that we received was put into the Squadron account since the Museum was primarily a paper entity and there was no Museum bank account. Later on, when the fact of the Museum began to take on more and more importance, especially with the possibility of getting the Castle & Cook buildings, it was decided to take a portion of what we, by then, considered OUR money, and put it into a Museum account so that we could use it to further Museum business.

Obviously, the line of demarcation between the Museum and the Squadron was becoming extremely vague as far as we as a group were concerned

Now, all of this was done very openly as far as our own group was concerned and many announcements were made at the various meetings telling the membership what was being done and why. The problem was that we were, inadvertently, drifting further and further away from our relationship with HQ and certainly drifting away from the rules and regulation regarding our status as a Squadron, since no one had really thoroughly read through the By-laws!!

Again, it's not any one's fault, its just that we all started getting carried away because were getting fairly successful and had a lot of pretty fancy ideas.

When HQ got wind of the fact that we had a parallel organization set up they decided to make an audit of our finances to see what was going on. Happily, thanks to Rosemary Netto, our financial records were in excellent shape. The main bone of contention, at that time, was the fact that we had transferred funds from the Squadron to the Museum and as far as HQ was concerned our Museum did not have a place in the CAF structure since

Midland was all the museum they felt was necessary. Consequently, they made no bones about the fact that they felt that the funds belonged to the CAF as represented by the Squadron and they wanted the money put back.

Another problem surfaced at about the same time regarding insurance for the '93 air show. HQ maintained that as a unit we were obligated to purchase insurance from them for the air show. The cost for HQ insurance was based on an estimate of the number of people attending which we rather grandly said would be 10,000. As a result their insurance would have cost in excess of 10,000 dollars. On our own we obtained it for about 3500 dollars and at the same time, we made certain that CAF HQ was named as an additional insured.

Again, at the same time, to try to relieve the CAF of any liability with regard to the show, we made every effort to change the sponsorship of the show from the Estrella Squadron of the CAF to the Estrella Warbirds Museum, by changing signs, programs and everything we could think of at the last moment.

In spite of this, HQ has taken the position that there was a certain amount of liability exposure on their part. The By-laws clearly state that CAF shows shall be covered by HQ provided insurance. Since we contracted for our own insurance, HQ feels that they had to provide their own liability coverage and, therefore, we should pay for that portion that they had to provide for themselves. That's the 5700 dollar figure that they have mentioned, based upon the actual number of attendees.

Our Staff has taken issue with HQ because they feel that HQ was covered by our insurance, although, admittedly, not for the amount that HQ requires.

When HQ issued their so-called ultimatum this last May, both Gary Corippo and Jeff Welles went to Midland to present our side of the issues. At that time it was apparent

that the HQ Staff was being directed by a small but very powerful clique, who were not in the least interested in listening to our story. Since then there have been some very definite changes which we will mention later.

So, up until just lately there were three main areas of contention; the money that we transferred from the Squadron to the Museum that HQ wanted replaced; the insurance premium that HQ wanted us to pay and the fact that they did not even want to consider the thought of a Squadron museum.

For a number of weeks our Staff members discussed the issues and our relationship with HQ. In their belief that it was still in our best interests to continue a relationship with CAF HQ another letter was prepared requesting clarification of their position with regard to such things as a reorganization of the Squadron which might possibly include HQ taking over the lease with the City of Paso Robles; possible assistance from HQ with regard to the building of the museum; possible assumption of the loan from the City by HQ and finally, relief from the insurance premium they felt was owed by the Squadron for the '93 air show.

Much to the surprise of our Staff it was reported by Don that the tenor of the meeting was much more reasoned and conciliatory than the previous one attended by Corippo and Welles. He also reported that there seemed to be a decided change in the internal chain of command of the HQ Staff since the previous meeting, from the adamant clique which ruled with an iron hand, to a much more representative group willing to listen to reasonable input.

We are also informed that a number of other Wings and/or Squadrons have taken issue with HQ regarding their insurance plans and that a more reasonable structure is being definitely considered.

The upshot of the matter is that we have now received a new letter from the HQ Staff indicating a sincere willingness to "work through" our problems. They have a number of questions, naturally, with regard to our commitments with the City concerning the lease arrangements and loan and so on, but they have indicated a definite interest in trying to work out something agreeable to all concerned.

Interestingly enough, HQ is not totally opposed to the museum concept as we were led to believe. They have initially indicated that they would like to consider it as possibly a "satellite" museum of the American Airpower Heritage Museum at Midland. What this implies at this point we are not sure but it is certainly a different statement than the one we received in May.

It is the general consensus of opinion of our own Staff that our association with the CAF is a valuable one. We asked to become a Squadron because we all agreed with the mission and the goals of the CAF and we still do.

Most of our problems came about as a result of enthusiasm on our part without enough thought being given to our relationship with CAF HQ.

At this point it is the Staff's opinion that we should provide HQ with the answers to their questions which include a review of just what our present and future overall plans entail with regard to our physical plant as well as how we plan to finance all of it. These are certainly reasonable questions on their part and it is believed that by working with HQ we can iron out our problems.

It is also a fact, however, that as a Squadron and being located where we are, we have certain unique requirements that have to be considered. The Staff feels that we should do everything in our power to cooperate with CAF HQ but it must be realized that cooperation is a two way street. If we can't come to a workable understanding we may have to consider other alternatives.

Whatever is the end result of all these discussions there is one fact outstanding. We as a group, call us CAF or call us a Museum, are just as strong or stronger than we have ever been. We have over 150 members. We have put on some terrific air shows. With what we have learned through success as well as adversity we can refine our efforts and make future shows even better and more lucrative. We have over one hundred thousand dollars worth of buildings piled up at our new site, just waiting to be erected. Buildings that were GIVEN to us and that were taken down and transported by our own people.

We have dozens of members with drive and incredible abilities who can lead us to heights even beyond what we imagine at the present. We have every single attribute to make our organization the finest of its type in the country and one that can be a showplace and a community center for our entire city.

Those of you who have felt like drifting away thinking that we don't know where we are going, TAKE HEART! We're OK. Our basic precepts have never wavered for a moment. Hang in there and you will be rewarded ten-fold!

It's time to move!!! It's time to take down the last building at the almond plant. It's time to get the concrete poured for the pad at the new site and get our first building up and occupied!!

Let's shake off our lethargy, hitch up our pants and continue to do what we started off to do. Updated and final plans for the buildings are being prepared and we should be able to start leveling dirt and preparing the site almost immediately!!

WE CAN AND WILL DO IT!! LET'S GO!!!
