As aircrew you could volunteer or be appointed as, Co-pilot, Navigator, crew chief, loadmaster, Grunt, whatever, for a given flight or trip. Training for these positions will be offered as needed. See our resident Marine for instruction in the last category.

The idea is to give everyone a share in the responsibility for a trip. Given the number of airshows there are and the ability of the airplane to carry 6-7 people, everyone interested would be assured an opportunity to participate. If you've never experienced the thrill of arriving at an airshow in an aircraft like this, or even just a fuel stop, and seen the excitement these planes generate, then your in for a real treat, as well as a lot of gratification for your efforts.

Bottom line at this point is: A: Probably waiting to get into the

new building and creating a dedicated workplace before getting started. B: MONEY. We have a long way to go. The money collected so far was just enough to procure the airplane, buy a few items, and leave about 1100.00 in the bank. We NEED to nail down the spar kit (1500.00) Its the only used one available. Later a new one will be 4000.00! Every little bit helps. Somebody get busy and figure out some fund raising. How about local civic groups participating? Get the city involved (ha!). Start a "Spirit of Paso Robles" campaign. Call the newspapers). DO SOMETHING! If any of you out there really want this to happen then call me. Show your interest and "Get Busy".

"Suggestion Box"

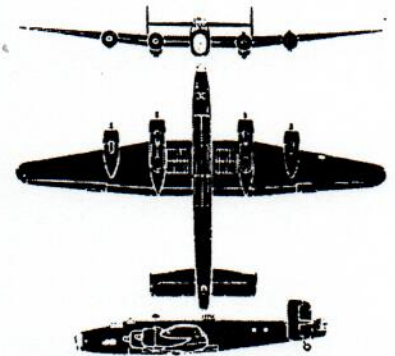
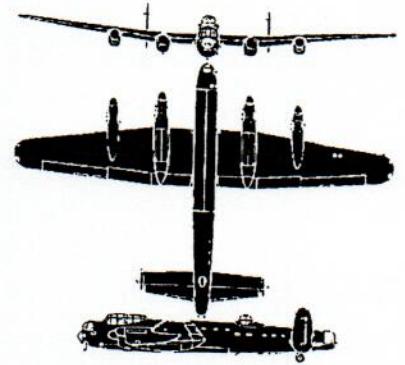

Paso Robles Air Show Update

Just 60 days and counting until the big event. . .the Paso Robles, "Aviation Through The Ages" Air Show! Things are coming together quickly and advanced tickets went on sale Saturday, April 1st.

You heard right, ladies and gentlemen, I said advanced tickets. We've decided to sell advanced ticket at the price of \$6.00 for adults and \$3.00 for children 12-5 years old and they are available at Thrifty Drug Stores, Pay Less Drug Stores and at the Paso Robles Chamber of Commerce. We are also investigating the use of a 1-800 number to sell tickets. The idea is to sell as many tickets as possible in advance as a type of "rain insurance", since the air show will continue no matter what the weather and tickets are non-refundable.

Ticket prices at the gate will be \$8.00 and \$4.00 respectively so there is an incentive to buy early. You may also purchase advanced tickets at the CAF meeting if you wish.

Blake Wideman, our Public Affairs Coordinator, has really been burning rubber on the acquisition of major sponsors. He has procured an in-kind trade with KSBY TV to feature our air show throughout the coming months, which will provide a considerable amount of local TV coverage. He has also worked a similar deal with the Country News for newspaper exposure and is currently following up on a few hot leads with a radio station. Ray Appleton, of talk show fame on KMJ 580, Fresno, is even a strong possibility for promotion. More on that next month. All in all, Blake has been really cranking. Look forward to a media barrage coming to a news source near you.

The big news for this newsletter is the firming of the plans for the Opening Gala to be held on Saturday night, June 3rd Pasquale Mastantuono has the lead on that project and has some great ideas lined up. The Gala will be the official opening ceremony set within a dinner-dance format with a 1940's USO theme. Entertainment will be provided by a Glen Miller-style band and there's even a possibility of a sunset pyro-type show by an aerial performer.

The menu will consist of top block, vegetables, salad and dessert pastries. All of the performers will be in attendance to sign autographs and talk shop. We're even inviting some of the city fathers for some added fun. Tickets for the event are \$15.00 for singles and \$25.00 for couples (\$10.00 for kids).
