Our program for the evening will be provided by one of our members, Robert C. (Bob) Kinsell. This is another case of trying to condense a mountain of incredibly interesting information into a small column for the newsletter.

Bob Kinsell was a Photo Recon pilot with the 8th Air Force in England during WWII. Flying an F5-G, he was hit by AA flak at 35,000 feet while photographing the German sub pens at St. Nazaire, France and was then bounced by four F-190's. Hit by cannon and machine gun fire and with his own aircraft on fire, he bailed out at 36,000 feet and was captured.

He was liberated from Moosburg International prison camp after 22 months in French hospital, Paris prison (German SS), and several different POW camps in Germany. He also survived the January 1945 forced march from Stalag Luft III.

After the war he graduated from U.S.C. with a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

From then on his list of accomplishments, awards, patents and activities fills up another two pages which would take half the newsletter. If the Flight Leader doesn't read the list during the introduction, your Editor will, because Bob has lived a most productive and contributory life.


Suffice it to say, this will be a most interesting program and we urge you all to attend. It's really a treat when we can get one of our own to tell us of his or her past experiences.

The T-33 Is Here!!!

For those of you who have not been to the Hangar lately we are pleased to announce that the long-awaited and at one time, somewhat nebulous, T-33 is not only at our Hangar but REASSEMBLED and inside!

This has been a long time labor of love by a number of different members, starting earlier this year when about 14 or 15 hardy souls traipsed up to Madera Airport and started working on the disassembly, also in the mud. Because of the question of ownership the project was put on hold for a time until the USAF decided it was ours with the not inconsiderable help of the city fathers of Paso Robles.

A second crew was dispatched after the ownership question was resolved to bring the tail section back which had been removed from the fuselage earlier. This was also done in the mud. The resulting operation was about as hairy as it gets with the tail section sticking out from every direction way over the limits of even our wide load permit and at night and in a fairly high wind. It was accomplished without incident, however, much to the relief of those involved.

The third crew was dispatched to separate the fuselage from the one piece wing and then transport both back by trailer. The separation was somewhat more difficult than the crew had been lead to expect but with the devotion of a few lying on their backs, again in the mud, which by this time was even wetter and slicker than the first two times, it was accomplished.

This trip was a piece of cake and the whole pile arrived intact that same evening. Two Saturdays later it was reassembled by our crack retrieval, assembly and restoration team under the able direction of Col. Al Schade!!

There were many different members involved in this wild operation and it

Hangar Security

As was mentioned in the December newsletter we have been given a security system by Great Western Alarms here in Paso Robles. This is a donation by Marion and Lynda Todd, owners of GWA. This is a full-on system which is monitored 24 hours a day at their downtown offices and they are set up to contact the police or fire departments as well as individuals at the moment anything happens. Both entrance doors are monitored for entry as well as breakage and the big hangar doors are guarded by a double light beam system (to avoid false alarms by the cat). There is also an alarm for our office trailer door and a motion detector for the inside so we can begin to work in there with office equipment, computers and the like and free up some space inside the Hangar as well as having a half way decent office.

This also puts a bit of responsibility on ourselves as well. Upon entering the building one must code in a response at our wall mounted control center. If this is neglected, a call will come from the GWA Alarm Center downtown asking for identification. If this is not handled properly the police and/or someone designated on the list of members will be notified.

False alarms get pretty annoying to the police so to avoid as much of a problem as possible, the access codes and lock combinations will not be given out to every member since there are many who seldom, if ever, need access other than at specified meeting or work periods. This is not to say that anyone is barred from entering at all. Anyone who has a need to enter the premises will be given the proper codes either at the time or whenever necessary. At this

point in time, however, the present combinations are known to half the populace of Paso Robles and we would like to restrict this.

Something is also going to have to be worked out with regard to the L-Bird groups. There are still instances of the plane or planes being taken out of the Hangar and the doors being left open with NO ONE in attendance. There is no point of having a security system if the hangar doors are left wide open with the front gate open as well.

We already have some items in our Museum that are fairly valuable and would be sorely missed if stolen. There are also any number of people who have offered to give us or loan to us various historic items, some of considerable value, but they want them protected.

So be advised that there are going to have to be some rules with regard to Hangar access.

This shouldn't be a problem because if we want something nice we are going to have to take care of it.
