The Estrella Warbirds Museum has had a windfall in receiving a North

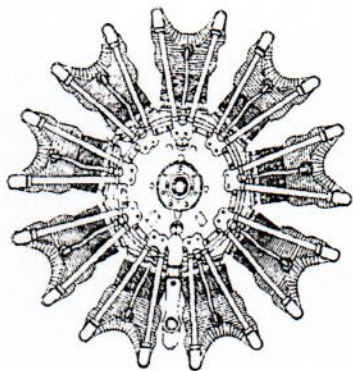

Resignations of office have been received from Gary Shepard, Operations Officer and James Wood, Safety Officer. The resignations were accepted by the remaining Staff members present. Being that a quorum was present there was a Motion by John to appoint Glen Thomson as Operations Officer to fill the remaining term vacated by Gary Shepard, Second by Al Schade, Passed. Vacancies still remain for XO and Safety Officer. Other Staff Members Present: None.

Minutes: The Minutes of the 6/19/97 Staff meeting were reviewed and accepted without correction.

Treasurers Report: None. (Rosemary on vacation.)

Newsletter: It was reiterated that we must expand our circulation and utilize bulk mail rates. Bruce Toomey will be reminded to consult with John about costs.

Security: The storage boxes on the east side of the hangar are being found open on a regular basis. No action.

Airshow: Net profit is approximately \$3800 to \$4100.

Squadron Display Area: Blake will appoint a committee to formulate a plan.

Museum PX Sales: Willa and Dewey Killion have set up a PX in the hangar and several sales have been made.

Bluegrass/Ford Luncheon: We will host the Atascadero Ford V8 Club on August 10. Dewey and Willa are the Chairmen and will need a lot of help with this project.

Officer Vacancies: In addition to the above mentioned positions in which there are now vacancies, we would like to establish a new position called Supply Officer. Al will write a job description for this position before we appoint someone. One of our major problems in the CAF is that we are not well organized. Officers, chairmen and members are not fully aware of all of the duties and responsibilities of the various positions and chairmanships. As a result there is a lot of crossover of work which causes concern and sometimes hard feelings from the responsible person. It was agreed that Staff would continue to address the subject of organization at future meetings.

New Business:

Air Show: Tentative date is June 7, 1998. First meeting to be held on August 19.

CAF/EWM Merger: Motion by John, second by Al that the CAF merge with the Museum with the CAF becoming the controlling body. The merger is predicated upon a suitable plan being developed. Jeff Welles began the plan and Blake is continuing with it. The plan must be reviewed by counsel to

ensure its legality and tax consequences. Passed.

Terms of Office: Motion by John, second by Al that the terms of the current Officers be extended from 9/30/97 to coincide with our fiscal year which ends on 12/31/97. Passed.

T-33: Al is looking for tip tanks to complete the project. Al presented a schematic to display the T-33 on a pedestal as well as an alternate plan to display it on small pad near the front gate. It was agreed that the pad concept was the best solution.

Aircraft Acquisition: Motion by Al, second by Glen that we pursue the possibility of obtaining any kind of aircraft for front gate display purposes from insurance companies. Passed.

Navion: The owner group of the Navion has donated the aircraft to the Museum. Stipulations to the donation are attached as Exhibit A. In summary, substantial progress on restoration must be achieved within the next 18 months and the owner group be allowed to operate airplane at 75% of the assigned dry rate. Motion to accept action of Museum Board by Al, second by Glen. Passed

Surplus Property: Glen explained the process of obtaining surplus property from the Govt. We have a scanner card which enables us to gain access to the various facilities and to select equipment.

Land Development: Glen presented a plan for the potential use of City land to the east of our property. More information is needed. No action was taken.

City of Paso Robles: The City wants us to plan on where and how we are going to display stages 1 and 2 of our rocket. Glen will present out plan to the City Planning Commission on Tuesday, July 22.

New Building: Glen presented a plan on the erection of our meeting building. He is recommending that we erect the building in modular stages because of our financial situation. There is an anonymous donation of

grounds. A sign to that effect will be placed on the vehicle.

Meeting of July 8, 1997.

**Attending:** Keith Bowers, Gary Corippo, John Cromwell, Al Davis, George Marrett, Glen Thomson, K.O. Ecklund and Blake Wideman  
Ed Stewart, Absent.

**Minutes:** The Minutes of the May 20, 1997 Meeting were read and approved.

**Old Business**

**Relationship of CAF/Estrella Warbird Museum.** Glen reiterated that the Museum is simply a paper entity but will continue to operate under the name of Estrella Warbird Museum for 501c benefits. The EWM will be a separate 'sub-committee' in the same fashion as the Airshow or restoration sub-committees. Blake stated that he would work to complete the Squadron/Museum overview started by Jeff Welles and have a draft and a flow chart of organization by the next meeting. It was also agreed that all actions by the EWM sub-committee would be brought before the Squadron Staff for review and approval.

**Cal Poly-Titan Carrier, J-3 Engine.**

We need to pick up the engine ASAP. Gary to arrange truck. Blake to work with Al Schade to cut up carrier into removable pieces and Gary will pick up these and engine at same time if possible.

(Ed. NOTE: all of the above accomplished!)

**DRMO Surplus:** We now have J-79 engine on site. Gary and Keith will remove engine from tank and build rolling display stand for it. Gary suggested we move ahead on securing tank turret from Rough & Ready. Just waiting for a call from Center on price for it. Authorization provided to purchase for a maximum of \$100. Glen offered to pay additional over \$100 in order to secure this educational display unit.

Gary will also write Tom Bordonaro for assistance in getting available tank(s) from Camp Roberts. Glen informed Board that a resolution was needed naming key individuals as authorized Scan-card holders to visit surplus sites and locate items for Museum, Gary moved, John 2nd to approve list for resolution. Passed unan.



**New Business**

Priorities. List of priorities revisited, post airshow, and number one was construction of activities building. As funds not great enough to build full 40x100 building, Blake suggested smaller 40x40 building be built with provisions for adding on when funds permit. Gary supported suggestion and much discussion was given to premise. Blake moved and John 2nd that plan be developed ASAP for approx. 40x40 building (1600 sq.ft.). Passed unan.

Other priorities listed on order were: finish removal of stuff from Cal Poly (done); set up and complete display proposal for 2nd stage of Titan; complete display of jet engine; set up pad for tank turret (if presented to us); 'clean up' IHC truck located at east side of Hangar and bring in Vampire fuselage cockpit section and begin restoration.

(Other New Business) Gary indicated that Wayne King has someone who wants the spare 40x200 foot building parts and pieces. Gary moved and John 2nd that we entertain a bid on said building. Final sale, if any would be on approval of Board (sub-committee).

Gary indicated that a crew from Camp Roberts would be at the Museum on July 9 to clean weeds and tidy up the area.

Navion- The Navion Group will donate aircraft to the Museum for restoration. The attached list of conditions were presented by Keith. Blake

moved, Al 2nd that we accept. Passed unan. Gary and Keith abstained due to ownership in aircraft.

New Tugs- Gary indicated hearing complaints about Squadron and Museum equipment being used for 'personal needs'. It was suggested that a rental amount be placed on said equipment and charged to persons using same. Persons using equipment for other than Squadron or Museum functions would also provide necessary insurance on same. Such a process would allow equipment (tugs) to be used by others such as Chuck Wentworth, CDF, Roger Oxborrow etc. as needed. Said fees could be in the form of money, trade-outs, donations of goods and services. etc.

Honorary Airshow Chairman. Keith indicated that Jeri proposed the idea of having a celebrity as an honorary airshow chairperson to help boost attendance. Consensus was that this idea be pursued.

Off-site vehicle use - Blake reminded Board that Squadron/Museum vehicles are not insured for other than on-site use and, therefor, should not be used for parades or other civic functions or run on the street without proper coverage.

Private aircraft relocated for air show - Blake informed committee that he had been advised that some aircraft had not been moved back to original locations after the airshow.

No further topics to be discussed, meeting adjourned at 9:57pm
