NAS Point Mugu Fighter Squadron 114



The Last Word

(Only because it's at the end of the newsletter!!)

According to some reports there still seems to be some confusion as to the status of the separation of the CAF Estrella Squadron and the Estrella Warbirds Museum. As a non-Staff member, just the newsletter writer, I would like to rehash this once more from my own "layman's" understanding but as one who has been close to this whole business, albeit, unofficially.

In my view, there are three "entities", the CAF as a whole, the CAF Estrella Squadron and the Museum.

The Squadron was chartered by CAF HQ and we are happy to operate under their aegis and abide by their rules and receive the benefits of their national recognition etc.

At one point in time the Squadron Staff decided that we needed a facility of our own and we approached the City. The City did not want to enter into a lease arrangement with an out of state corporation on the terms that we wished so the idea of the "museum" was formed which was to be a California, non-profit, 501c corporation.

This arrangement also allows for several advantages, among which is the fact that the Museum, (which now has state surplus receiver 9 designation), can accept offered artifacts of all types which remain the property of the local museum or are considered more or less "on loan" on from local basis. various governmental agencies.

All in all, the benefits are that; we are able to have a 501c California corporation; we can have a lease with the City; we can have a facility licensed by the State for the receipt of surplus material and, lastly, we can retain ownership of those items donated to the Museum. (If anyone or any group wishes to donate items to the CAF, that is just fine with us and

we are happy to be able to provide the choice).

The Museum, for all intents and purposes, is a "paper entity" formed for specific reasons. So as it now stands, there are two parallel but separate organizations here in Paso, the Squadron, as part of the CAF, and the Museum, as an individual corporation. The Museum MUST, by law, have a Board separate from the Squadron Staff. The Museum, operates as however. sub-committee of the Squadron, much like the Air Show committee, and reports to the Squadron Staff.

Evidently, the CAF HQ understands what we are doing and appear to be perfectly happy with the arrangement. After all, there are several other Wings, Squadrons or what have you all doing the same thing and HQ has accepted all of these.

There is no reason for this separation of and existence of the Museum and Squadron to be a problem. I, for one, admit to being a major grumbler in the past because I had erroneously felt that the Squadron and the CAF in general were being slighted or forced to take a second seat.

This is not true; the Museum exists and has immeasurable value but the Squadron is the entity providing the guidance for the overall operation.

To me now, this is a perfectly simple and workable situation. It's only a problem if we make it a problem.

So, let's put our animosities, our grumbling and our little

personal snits behind us and work like hell to make this group the best that we can make it.!!

The REAL Last Word

I realize that I get to be a motor-mouth when I get wound up but I am so excited about things that are possible for us that I just can't stop.

We have some potential opportunities coming up that could beat anything that has ever happened in the past. We have more aircraft being promised to us and more artifacts on the way. We have a nifty facility even now with better to come. We have a steadily improving exterior and are slowly cleaning up the place.
