This promises to be an interesting and fun evening. Lets all try to be there.


## SKILLS QUESTIONNAIRE

He looks at a fuselage or a wing section and knows just where the seams are to dismantle it and what the brackets are like that hold it together. His life-long association with so many different aspects of the whole aviation scene has proven to be an overwhelming asset to our organization

For all of the above and for jump-starting a whole new attitude toward getting things done, we are happy to salute Al Schade as our "Star of the Month".
