
The latest major improvement is the barbecue area with its wind buffer wall and the big pit in the center. Its not quite finished but it wasn't even started when we had our last meeting!

includes sponsoring expensive acts and exotic aircraft which can make or break the show. With this money on hand the receipts from the gate are considered profit, less certain other items such as a gate fee for the City and other expenses that are determined by the number of people attending and/or the net receipts, etc.

So... the upshot of all this is that sponsorship is vital and this is one area where each member can help. Now we are not asking that everyone should go out and pound on doors but we are asking that if you know someone that would be a good candidate for sponsorship, please let Gary May know the name. At that point, Gary or Chuck or some other committee member will call on the individual with the new Air Show Sponsorship prospectus, which is pretty nice, by the way, and try to interest him or her in being a show sponsor.

This the kind of event that can appeal to a business owner if increased numbers of people are attracted to the area and this holds for many different kinds of businesses. Others have other reasons but they all result in sponsorship.

So there you have it. You don't have to call on anyone or embarrass yourself by putting the bite on a friend if this kind of thing bothers you. Armed with attractively produced promotional information, Gary and others will make the pitch in a highly ethical and professional way. They just need the names of those who are in a position of importance to their business or those who could easily contribute to such a fine upstanding organization!.

The reason that it is necessary to start early is because many businesses set up their budgets well in advance of the new year and we need to be included in their expense picture if we are going to receive funds.

Just think of it. If each member could come up with one name and if we could

get only \$100 from each business we would have over \$14,000! This alone would go a long way toward funding the Show!

As an added bonus, Gary and Chuck are working on an in house contest for those turning in the most names. This will entail various worthwhile items, such as dinners and other types of incentives for those people who produce the most cooperative names or even the greatest number of names.
