This should be one heck of an interesting evening.

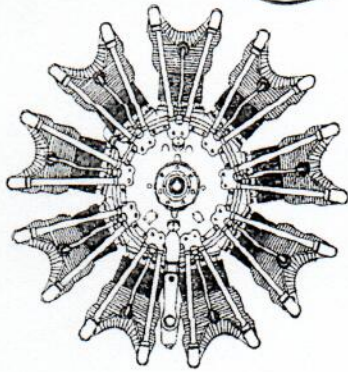

### Trash Problem
