Cromwell moved, seconded by C. Miller to accept Treasurers Report. Passed unanimously.

Airshow Report/Chuck Miller

A parachute team, "Just in Time", has been signed as an act for the 2001 Airshow as well as Chuck Wentworth flying the Legacy Flight with the F-18's from Lemoore, Jack Sinton Helicopters will perform a comedy routine and the CDF will participate with a simulated fire drop. As of 4-18-01, Airshow acts under contract include the Silver Wings with

Margie Stievers - Wing Walker, "Russian Thunder", John Colliver and his AT-6 doing a Salute to Veterans, "Wild Thing" the China Doll C-47 from Camarillo plus U.S. Army tracked vehicles from Camp Roberts, helicopters from VAFB and a 30 man mass parachute drop from the USMC. The 2001 36 member Airshow Committee. plus a Military subcommittee have been meeting for the past five months to get everything ready for the August 25th Dinner Dance and the September 9th Airshow.

Chuck reminded the Board that the Estrella Warbird Museum needs to get someone lined up to be the Director for the 2002 Airshow since he will retire after this year's show. Cromwell moved and Marty Wright seconded to have Chuck and Betty get bids from some professional Airshow Producers for the Board to consider. Motion passed unanimously.


