On September 24, 2001, "Bird Flight", composed of Bob Foote, Obbie Atkinson and George newsletter. Marrett flew a formation flyby for Steven Lively over the 4. Treasurer's Report: Templeton Cemetery. Lively, 80 years old died on September 19, 2001 at his home in Templeton, California

Lively served in the United States Army for 24 years being involved in the invasion of Normandy at Utah Beach during World War II and the Inchon Landing during the Korean War.

For his combat activity in these two wars he was awarded many medals including the Bronze Star.

Lively retired from the Army in 1965. He was nicknamed "Sarge" by his fellow soldiers and the nickname continued to follow him into civilian life.

Bird Flight carries the name and presence of the Museum many times each year in formation flights over various ceremonies including Member and Military funeral services.

Presently they are scheduled for a Pioneer Day flyby and at Veterans Day ceremonies in Los Osos.




