Our guest speaker will be Colonel Colin C. Reilly, USAF (Retired).

Colin Reilly lives in Morro Bay, CA. His military career spans 32+ years. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps in 1942 and finished in 1974 as Air Force Mission Commander in Saudi Arabia. He served two combat tours, the first in WWII in North China flying the P-51 Mustang; the second in Viet Nam and Thailand flying the Super Spad A-1E.

Flying was not only a career, but also a real love. Of course, early on it was conventional tail draggers which included training aircraft, then over 500 hours in the P-40 Tomahawk and various models of the A-36 and P-51 Mustang. Moving into jets in 1949, he logged time in the F-80, T-33, F-84, F-86, F-102, F-104, F-106 and finally the F-5B and E.

There were assignments which moved him out of the cockpit. However, the thrill of flight was absent. It was a genuine privilege for him to serve his country in many capacities and to stand side by side with some GREAT American Airmen.


