Our Guest Speaker: Dwight Fegley

Dwight is a pilot for North American Jet Charter, flying as Captain on the 30 and 60 series Learjets. Dwight grew up on a farm in Ohio, and is a graduate of Moody Aviation, a branch of Moody Bible Institute of Chicago, Illinois. At Moody, Dwight earned his Commercial, Seaplane, Instructor and Multi-engine licenses.

Dwight's wife Vicki graduated from Fort Wayne Bible College in Fort Wayne, Indiana. They moved to Redlands, CA in 1982 and served interdenominational group called Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) based in Redlands for 17 years. Twelve of those years were spent overseas, when they moved to Indonesia in 1984, where Dwight was flying and maintaining single engine Cessna aircraft.

Dwight has flown nearly 50, 000 people in his career, most of them in the Cessna 185. Other aircraft flown were the Cessna 206 and the Caravan. Dwight took up a position teaching maintenance at the MAF mission headquarters in Redlands in 1997, and moved on to North American Jet in the Summer of 1999. He has over 8,000 hours of flying time. Vicki works in the Attendance Office at the Paso Robles High School. Dwight and Vicki live in Paso Robles with their two children, Kenny and Stephanie, both born overseas, who attend Lewis Middle School and Paso Robles High School. Dwight and Vicki look forward to sharing some of their varied experiences with you.

Board of Directors Meeting Highlights

August 21, 2002

The meeting was called to order by President Betty Miller at 6:00 pm with 13 of the 16 Board Members present. Minutes were approved as written and the Treasurers Report was presented and approved. (See Copy later in this Article)

Old Business:

- 1. Glen Thomson gave a tour to the Board of the new redwood fencing that he and Ron Brooks have installed around the BBQ pit. This should help our BBQ crew to combat errant winds.
- 2. Obbie Atkinson reported on a meeting he had to go over ideas for improving our offerings to our members. Recent members Ed and Pam Morrison have stepped forward to help Obbie with Membership. Many Thanks Ed and Pam!
- 3. Al Schade reported that he needs a fuel line for the Navion which will be a special order and run \$75.00. Board approved expenditure which will allow the Navion wings to be mated to the rest of the aircraft once it is installed.
- 4. Chuck Miller reported that White's

Drywall are scheduled to start installing the metal studs for the two-hour fire wall on the Museum Hangar on Tuesday, Aug 27th. He needs a crew to remove the existing tin from the west wall on Saturday. Board Members Ron Brooks, Ed Chidlaw, Wally Engle, Glen Thomson and Tom Weiss volunteered to be at the Museum at 8:30 am to help Chuck. (We have a Board that is to be commended for stepping forward and doing the hard work when it is needed!)

- 5. Job Descriptions for Safety Chairman and Supply Chairman were handed out by Al Schade for review. These will come up at the September 18th meeting for approval.
- 6. Museum 10 Year Plan. The Board was asked to take parcel layout maps and indicate where future buildings and and artifact areas should be. A suggested layout from <u>Gary Corippo</u> was reviewed & discussed. The Board will review other layouts at the next Board Meeting.

New Business:

- 1. Dinner Dance Producer Betty Miller went over the plans for the September 20-21 Dinner Dance. We need to have volunteers for the Bar, ticket taking, and Host and Hostesses. Time is getting short.
- 2. <u>Ed Chidlaw</u> reported that he has the ID badges for DRMO surplus ready to send off for issue.
- 3. <u>David Highland</u> asked the Board to consider putting an ad in the Atascadero Colony Days Marching Band Competition program. It was approved to take out a 1/4 page ad for \$50.00 as advertising.
- 4. Jackie Brooks has indicated that she

would be willing to take over the Gift Shop at the Museum. Betty will contact her and get this set up.

- 5. Al Schade reported that it will take at least a crew of 8 people to go to Yuma in October to pick up the F-4 Phantom aircraft. A date will be set. Anyone interested in helping should contact Al. While in Yuma, a side trip to El Centro will be made to check out an F-14 Tomcat aircraft that has been located by member Wayne King. If it is acceptable, plans will be made to transport that aircraft at a later date.
- Negotiations are still underway on obtaining an F-8 aircraft to add to the Museum fleet.
- 7. Betty Miller asked the Board to consider authorizing <u>Carol Weiss</u>, and Betty to attend a conference in San Francisco October 8 on Museum display techniques and preservation. The cost will be \$130.00 for two. Approved.
- 8. Corporate Member, Les Fox of Fox Graphix and Multimedia, will take on the job as Newsletter Editor beginning with the October issue. (A Bio appears elsewhere in this issue.)

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.




