MEET JOHN HIMES



Most of you know John as our Chef, and avid supporter of the Estrella Warbird Museum. John plans all our monthly Dinner Meetings, and was the Culinary Mastermind in getting out dinners to 200 + people in 20 minutes

during the USO Show and Dinner Dance! John is a winemaker, chef, and businessman. What you may not know is rest of the story"!

John Himes was born in East Grand Rapids MI and grew up in Holland MI until he was 20. He began his college career at Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo, where he thought he wanted to be an engineer until he met up with calculus and chemistry then he decided that maybe a career in business was more suited to his learning ability.

After becoming disenchanted with the snow and cold of Michigan, John headed for the warmer climes of Scottsdale, AZ in 1960. He finished up his college at Arizona State University with a BS in Accounting in 1965. John earned his CPA certificate in 1970 while working for Arizona State as an Internal Auditor. He then worked for Del Webb Corp in Phoenix as the Assistant Manager of their Internal Audit department. This gave John a chance to travel to many of their properties. While living in Arizona, John married his first wife Beth and raised two daughters, Gretchen, now 34 and Sarah, now 32.

However something was missing, John found he was not happy doing this kind of work. So in January of 1976 he quit his job and moved his family to San Luis spo where he built and opened the Taylor Rental Centers in San Luis, Atascadero and Paso Robles. In 1983, John got rid of the rental businesses following his divorce from Beth. Putting his Accounting skills back to work he used it to go to work in the County Auditor Controller's

office in San Luis Obispo, until 1987 when he purchased Paper Works Printing in Atascadero, which he owned until 2001. John says owning his own business was more challenging and rewarding than the accounting profession.

Becoming interested in Spirituality in 1998, John began to read every book he could find and looked for people who had read and understood the same books. After receiving an email one day he found someone as interested as he. John says, "I knew that there was something special about her from that very first letter. She is now my wife Mira." Mira was born in Russia but lived her whole life in Latvia except for her University years. She has one son, Dima who is 28 and lives in Saint Petersburg, Russia. Her mother is a retired school teacher who lives in Riga, the capital of Latvia. Mira holds a masters degree in Hydrology and has traveled extensively in the old Soviet Union and in the Scandinavian countries in pursuit of her career. She loves to read and is a teacher of Tai Chi.

After their engagment, the INS took 7 months to issue her a visa to be with John so they could get married. They are currently working on getting Mira a "Green Card" so that she will have permanent status. This process has taken over 4 months for the INS to agree to process that paperwork, and will take a year to complete. John says someday he will "write a book about all this. It will be a cross between humor and a tradgedy!"

trailer with Mira and John Himes as passengers, towed by John Dolan and Dave Geiger.


USMC jeep driven by Gary Corippo with passenger Al Schade dressed in his USMC uniform.
