


Vought F-8 Crusader

Estrella Warbird Museum

Our stalwart Aircraft Restoration Crew led by Restoration Chariman AL Schade, drove to the Hornet in the driving rain on December 17 to load up the fuselage and tail from the carrier deck. Another trip will be required to bring down the wing section.

Now Crusader restoration begins! Gary Corippo applies plenty of Marine-style TLC as he scrapes the newest Museum acquisition readying it for sanding and then painting. Gary was instrumental in locating this aircraft and getting the negotiations underway to acquire it from the USS Hornet Museum.

Gary is asking for some volunteers to help him scrape and sand this wonderful aircraft. If you can spare an hour or two, call him at 238-2090 for more info.

(Remember our A-4 Skyhawk came to us in boxes and buckets, and just look at it now!)

The F-8 Crusader was first flown as the XF8U-1prototype on March 25, 1955. It was one of the first supersonic fighters and pushed back the boundaries of naval aviation in the 50's and battled with Migs in Vietnam a decade later. Pilots thought of the Crusader as the ultimate dogfighter - light, maneuverable and packing heavy cannon armament.

The F-8 Crusader is a single seat naval fighter aircraft powered by one Pratt & Whitney J57-P-20A afterbburning turbojet engine with 17, 963 lbs of thrust. The maximum speed is Mach 1.7 (1,117 mph) at 40, 000 feet. This aircraft has a ceiling of 59,000 feet and a range of 1, 029 miles. When it was in combat the aircraft carried four 20-mm Mk. 12 cannon with 144 rounds per gun; up to four AIM-9 Sidewinders AAMs, or eight 500-lb bombs, or eight Zuni rockets, or two AGM-12A or 12B Bullpup attack missiles. The Crusader was very fast for a naval fighter and could outrun most land-based types. The very short range Mig-21's it faced in Vietnam were slightly faster, but only at high level.

The Crusader is 90 feet long, 16 feet high and has a wing pan of 35 feet. This is a great addition to our growing fleet and anyone who can scrape or sand is needed to get it back to display condition.

Phantom F-4 Update

A group of workers is needed to accompany Restoration Director Al Schade to Yuma, Arizona to pick up the complete F-4 aircraft that the Museum has acquired. The trip is in the final stages of planning and anyone who wishes to go and help out should call Al at 927-8303.



Work in Progress on Museum Aircraft





As many of you remember we had a very LARGE, black hangar cat named "Aileron". Aileron is an extremely affectionate,






