Our speaker for the evening will be Col. Richard C. Lathrop, USAF Ret. Colonel Lathrop's early career extended from 1943, including two combat tours in the Southwest Pacific Area in WWII. until 1946 when he re-entered civilian life (as a Captain in the Army Air Force Reserve) and re-entered the University of Wisconsin where he earned a BS and MS in electrical engineering and physics and ultimately a PhD in 1953.

He returned to active duty in 1951 and had an extremely varied and interesting career, attending the Air Force Test Pilot School and eventually becoming Commandant of the School in 1959. He was on the faculty of the Air Force Academy and served with the US Military Assistance Group in Pakistan in 1965 and 1967. This just

goes on from one fascinating assignment to another including combat tours in Vietnam, until his retirement in 1974. Please refer to his short biography on page 7. It's well worth reading.

Big Plans For The Future!

And the future is now!! As you all know, there has been much discussion about a possible new building which would be a real museum, somewhere grounds. After consideration your Board of Directors has determined that the cost of erecting a completely new building, which would include permits, very expensive engineering etc., is just not within the realm of reason. The Board has come up with an entirely different plan, part of which has been under consideration for some time, and that is to extend the Museum to the north by the 35 feet that was originally allowed for and then add 20 feet to the south across the front of the existing Museum.

The interior would have a separate hangar for our display aircraft and a dedicated museum area of 80' v 55'. The additional 20' x 80' at the south end would house a 20' x 45' Gift Shop. There has been considerable discussion regarding the function of the remaining 20' x 35' space, including the possibility of relocating our existing Research Library to that

area. This would allow easy access for everyone and would conform to the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act. (ADA)

Although the addition to our existing Museum Hangar would save us the considerable expense involved in a new building, preliminary estimates place the cost of a remodel at approximately \$150,000.00 to see the project through to completion

as you all know, Glen Again, Thomson has donated his Cessna 310 to the Museum to be sold at whatever is the current market price. While this is a fantastic offer it is not known just when the aircraft will be sold nor for what amount In any event, whatever is obtained for the aircraft has also been marked for many other projects that have been outlined by our Facility Projects Planning Committee. These include a better BBQ roof, a storage building, fencing, paved aircraft display area, sealing and striping of the parking lot and a redesigned bar area and others.

The Board has decided to "bite the bullet", so to speak, and has approved a plan to raise the necessary money to get started on the project as soon as possible.

A sub-committee has been appointed to develop ideas for the new Museum addition to be presented to the architect/engineer. The members will be: For the Museum, Betty Miller and Carol Weiss; for the Gift Shop, Jackie Brooks; for the Library, K.O. Eckland. Ed Chidlaw, Chuck Miller, Glen Thomson and Gary Corippo will be meeting with architects, contractors and the City of Paso Robles to work on construction details.

This means, troops, that we are going to have to have one heck of a fund raising plan to get this off the ground! Fly-ins, USO Shows, and several other ideas are being considered but the fact remains that we are all going to have to do our best to interest people and businesses from all over the Central Coast and beyond to contribute to this improvement of a "destination" facility for the benefit of the entire community. More on this later!

Buy-A-Block

Our Buy-A-Block program is doing well but we need at least two more people to step forward so that we can complete an order for 20 plaques. This is a great opportunity to have your name permanently installed on the concrete pad in front of Restoration Building like those on the north side of the Museum. 

G.W. Alarm: Our insurance agent Brian Webster recommends we not change


the contract with the Alarm company. By Consensus -- we will leave things as they are,-with the addition of Motion Lights on the buildings.



Brief Biography of Richard C. Lathrop

Richard C. Lathrop was born in Wauwatosa Wisconsin in 1924. He grew up in Wauwatosa, a suburb of Milwaukee. He graduated from Wauwatosa High School in 1942, and attended the University of Wisconsin briefly before enlisting in the Army Aviation Cadet program.

He graduated from flying training in February 1944, and trained as a B-25 low altitude attack pilot. He served in this capacity with the 345th Bomb Group in the Southwest Pacific Theater in WWII, where he flew two combat tours of duty. Returning to civilian Life in 1946 (but as a Captain in the Army Air Force Reserve) he re-entered the University of Wisconsin and earned the BS and MS in electrical engineering and physics, and ultimately a PhD in 1951.

Returning to active duty in the Air Force in 1951, he held several engineering positions, specializing in automatic flight control of aircraft. In 1955, he attended the Air Force Test Pilot School, and then served on the faculty of that school for several years before becoming Commandant of the Air Force Test Pilot School in 1959. He served on the faculty of the Air Force Academy from 1961 through 1965. He served with the US Military Assistance Advisory Group (MAAG) in Pakistan (1965-67) as professor and chairman of the electrical engineering department, Pakistan Air Force College of Engineering. During this period, he also served as instuctor pilot in the MAAG C-54 aircraft.

In 1967-68, he served (as a Lt. Col.) a combat tour in VietNam as an AC-47 "Gunship" pilot. He flew 173 night combat missions, using the unique side-firing AC-47 aircraft, which is basically the old DC-3 aircraft adapted into an attack mode. Returning to the United States in 1969, he had several research and development management positions at the Air Force Missile Development Center. After promotion to Colonel and attendance at the Naval War College, he become the Technical Director at the Air Force Flight Test Center, Edwards AFB...

Col. Lathrop retired from the Air Force in 1974, and became the Director of the after-hours engineering masters degree program at Edwards AFB, which was operated by California State University - Fresno. He continued in that role for 15 years, and personally taught many of the courses in that program.

Richard Lathrop now resides in Paso Robles with his wife Lillian.
