




#### NEW TREES PLANTED IN THE NEW PICNIC AREA!

**MOTION:** Glen Thomson moved to allow the Ultralite group to meet here with supervision. Second by: Betty Miller. CARRIED.


Our flag pole now has three places for flags. Discussion followed on replacing our current American flag. Also having a special Museum flag with our Logo made.
