
"Surviving Pearl" -- & WWII

A Note from the Prez...

From President Charles Miller

I wish you all a very Happy Fourth of July and I hope you had a great First Day of Summer on the 21st. of June.
The Museum is really doing great! Our newly sworn in Board of Directors held their

first meeting in another museum -- the Camp Roberts Military Museum. The change in venue occurred as a result of a visit our two Artifact Co-ordinators made last month. Carol Weiss and Betty Miller came back and told us that the changes in that museum were absolutely great and that they felt the Directors needed to see it. Thanks to Dirk Hale (one of our members as well) and Gary McMaster an invitation to our Board was given and accepted. I must say that their volunteer staff has done an outstanding job of displaying artifacts and telling a story. I would highly recommend that all of you put it on your list of places to visit this year. You only need to produce a picture ID and possibly your registration and Proof of Insurance for your vehicle to get on base. They are open on Thursdays and Saturdays (there is another article about them in this newsletter with

If you haven't yet noticed, we now have a shaded patio area to the north of Thomson Hall where you can sit and sip a cool beverage while you watch visiting airplanes fly in and out! All this because of the hard work of Ed Chidlaw, Forrest Johnson and Ron Brooks! This talented trio got a drawing put together, figured up the cost of materials and presented their idea to the

Board and then once they had approval really got in and made it all happen! Thank you Ed, Forrest and Ron!! We also have a new addition to our Museum Fleet! Our Aircraft Acquisition Officer, Gary Corippo located and then got the paperwork in place to obtain a OV-10 Bronco from DRMO. The aircraft last belonged to the BLM before it was taken out of service. (The OV-10 is the twin boomedtail aircraft that our local CDF Air Attack Base uses as a spotter aircraft, and was used by the US Army, USMC, and others prior to that as a surveillance aircraft in jungle warfare during the Vietnam War, Desert Storm, and the Iraq War.) Gary put together an Acquisition Crew consisting of Ron Boyte, Rob Kinnear, John Dolan, Dave Geiger, Ron Brooks, Ed Morrison, Glen Thomson, Al Schade and himself to drive up to Mather AF Base near Sacramento and spend two and 1/2 days dismantling the craft. Then they had to load two trailers and some trucks and transport the aircraft and extra parts to its new home at the Estrella Warbird Museum. They have unloaded the fuselage and will be unloading the wing section and then start bolting everything back into place. Once the assembly is complete, the airplane will go onto the restoration schedule for paint touchup, etc. The OV-10 will be another beautiful aircraft that we can be proud of. The last thing I would like to update you all on is the fact that your Board of Directors voted to update our Master Plan with the addition of a Vehicle Storage Building and a new Artifact Exhibit Hall. We will not only need to construct the buildings but will need to get concrete pads laid out to display our aircraft properly, with hard surface walkways to allow ease of viewing. There is even a nice rest area planned where you can sit and enjoy the sight of so many wonderful aircraft in your own backyard. Our most crucial problem is getting a place built that is waterproof, dust proof, bird proof, and has climate control for all our wonderful artifacts, uniforms, photos and paintings. Our Hangar is simply that--a hangar and once an artifact is damaged because of the elements, we can never get it back.



To do this will take funding. Gary Corippo has put together a Fund Raising Committee of Obbie Atkinson, John Whitworth, Paul Clark and Betty Miller and they have created a letter and a flyer showing the anticipated project, which will be sent out to our Membership first and then to the general public. The Board of Directors is leading the way with financial pledges. Hopefully you will all help out in any way you can to support this fund raising effort. Our

Museum is getting recognition from all over the United States, Canada and even Europe. As you know we are all working together to preserve these aircraft and related memorabilia to help our future generations appreciate and honor those who worked on designing, engineering, constructing, maintaining, flying, and supporting our military in the tough job of preserving our wonderful freedoms we all enjoy.
