

After a one-month fire-season delay, speaker for Nov 2nd is Ann Le Bris. She is one of two female pilots statewide contracted to fly California Department of Forestry (CDF) tankers.

Ann grew up in rural France, didn't intend to come to the United States. She tried to get into the French Navy to fly planes but being 5-foot, 1-inch tall, she was not accepted because she was "too short."

Six years ago she applied to the CDF, was accepted and now flies the Grumman S-2F. Another goal is to eventually fly humanitarian missions in Africa.

"I like the idea of fighting fires, it is useful, it's like going to war except everyone wants you to win."

Fellow CDF tanker pilot Chuck Lees: "In this business you get respect by how good a pilot you are and how well you get along with other people. ...She's prob ably one of the best."


