# January 4 Program: "History of Aviation"

Al Schade, a founding member of the Estrella Warbird Museum and member of the board, will be the January 2006 guest speaker.

Schade had the distinction of being the youngest sergeant in the Marine Corps during World War II. He served as an aviation machinist's mate and aerial gunner in the Douglas SBD "Dauntless" serving aboard the USS Coral Sea. His pilot taught him to fly.

After his time in the Corps, Schade continued his flight education, getting his pilot's license, instrument rating, multiengine rating and A&P (aircraft mechanic) rating. "I had all the FAA ratings that were available," said Schade.

After the war Schade went to work for North America Aircraft Corporation. Then the Marine Corps recalled many veterans (he was in the Marine Corps Reserve) in order to form a full division to fight in the Korean War. Schade took part in the drive to the North and action in the Chosin Reservoir.



#### BRAC Process Moves Ahead

After two years of rancorous debate and attempts by some members of Congress to derail the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) process, Citizens Against Government Waste (CAGW) and its allies in the Pentagon and on Capitol Hill prevailed, stopping a last-ditch effort in the House of Representatives to block the BRAC Commission's proposed closure of 22 U.S. military installations and realignment of 33 others. As enacted into law, the new BRAC round will over the next 20 years save an estimated \$35 billion that the Pentagon wants



to allocate to more urgent national security priorities.


