

They spent three days working with us and we were able to make a great deal of progress. Please notice that all of the paintings, prints and photos in Thomson Hall are now labeled. They are cross-referenced in a card file and in the Accession Book as well.

We have a ways to go to get everything done but we have made major strides and really treasure the invaluable help the Duck's gave us.

Carol and I are proceeding with the final layout for the interior of Freedom Hall. Even though we have 4900 square feet, over 300 square feet is allocated to the Gift Shop and we have so many displays that we don't have any vacant space! The only vehicle in Freedom Hall will be the 1912 Model T (Ambulance) The restored jeeps and trucks will remain in the Hangar along with the large engines. The Bede will be moved into Freedom Hall, along with the VariEze which will be fitted with the computerized simulator as part of our interactive flight exhibit.

We will have a small enclosed area with a large TV screen and separate speakers for showing historical videos & CD's.

There will be more wall space to display our many large paintings, prints and photos along with corresponding models and information. We have several display cabinets which are currently in storage that will be filled with artifacts that are also in storage at the present time.

Our proposed work room/office/storage area is rather small, but we will retain the current office/store room in the Hangar for any overflow. We have some four drawer filing cabinets (donated by Dick Reddick) and two desks with ample storage (Pt. Mugu) so we will be able to access files easily.






