Golf Tournament Wrap-Up

We had 6 \$250 sponsors and 5 \$150 sponsors. Obviously, we could use more sponsors as that is where tournaments make their profit. The forty-four paid players netted us about the same as the 11 sponsors. Next year we should try to find a "tournament sponsor" who may be willing to put up \$2500 or more as the main sponsor. We could also get someone to sponsor the golf carts for the players. If we can do this we could lower the entry fee, and, hopefully, attract more players.

More golf course volunteers could be used. I hesitated to accept Paso Robles Ford offer for a car and Powerhouse's offer for an all terrain vehicle for hole-in-one prizes as I competition (insurance reasons). It would be nice to get more membership involvement in this. Right now it is a case of all the "The usual suspects" for the volunteer situation, i.e. the same people always can be depended on to do the work.

Hole-in-One prizes: Perhaps next year we could see if Pigs-can-Fly or some other aircraft dealer might be interested in an airplane for a hole-in-one prize. After all, we are about flying and an airplane would generate some interest. I do not know if there insurance available to cover this contingency, however.

Due to a significant family commitment next year at this same time, I'll not be available. I do believe moving it to the latter half of September or early October would not find us in conflict with other golf events and the weather should still be good. Times in June, July and August are not available because of all the other events already on-tap, wasn't certain we could get the people to cover the holes. Two per hole are required for a hole-in-one

We can expand some of the other competitions within the event to generate more interest. Incorporating more "Closest-to-Pin" prizes is easy to do. We could also offer some other "games within the game" things such as a buy-in and a skins game. To do this we would need to have someone dedicated to running that part of the operation the day of the tournament. The museum wouldn't gain revenue from these events, but they do generate interest.

Our tournament was scheduled for a Monday. Weekdays have advantages and disadvantages. The advantage is that the courses usually charge less for weekdays than weekends, hence, we can charge less. Weekends probably have more golfers available so the entry pool is bigger. I recommend we stick with the weekday.

For those who were at the luncheon: how did the door prize distribution seem to you? Did we have too many or not enough? Was the "lottery" method the best way to hand them out?

I tried to keep the check-in as easy as possible. However, one thing was subject to confusion: Even though each player was told their drink coupon was for the museum, not the golf course, several tried to get complimentary drinks from the golf course that led to some confusion. Next time we set it up so that the drink coupons are only available at the museum. This will entail ensuring the museum has an accurate player's list for the event.

An area that needs some study is the nature and amount of publicity around the tournament. I'm not sure we got much out of our advertising other than to get the museum's name "in print". By far the majority of sponsors and players came from direct contact, although we did get one door prize as a result of the chamber of commerce flyers. There was one phone call, which did not lead to an entry, from the radio spots. The problem with the radio spots may have been that they were too late to have much effect.

If we want this event to go bigger next time, we'll need a more formal arrangement vis-à-vis a committee, especially when it comes to contacting businesses for sponsorships and door prizes. I made 122 contacts, which resulted in 30 sponsors/door prize donors. I assume a 10% response rate is not bad, but if we are to get more sponsorships and entrants we need more people beating the bushes as it was direct contact that paid off.

I do want to thank all those members of the board and other members who helped out. If there is anyone who is owes a thanks it is I to all those who pitched in and made this event a go.




