September 6: "Missile Era" Ken Richardson Hughes Aircraft COO (Retired)

D. Kenneth Richardson retired in 1991 as President and Chief Operating Officer of Hughes Aircraft Company. Richardson, who lives in Santa Barbara, California, reminds one of movie idol Jimmy Stewart, with his tall, slim build and soft-spoken humor. He was always optimistic about the future of the electronic giant Hughes Aircraft Company and a strong supporter of the defense of the United States.

Born in Honolulu, Hawaii, Ken graduated from Punahou School and received his BS degree in mechanical engineering, magna We actually started the month on July 31 with a great trip to Vandenberg Air Force Base. We received a warm welcome from Colonel Jack Weinstein and his wife cum laude, from Tufts University in Massachusetts. He earned an MSME, cum laude, from the University of Southern California (USC), an MBA from the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) and he completed the UCLA Executive Program. The great success of Hughes Aircraft Company came about because of the superior management by Richardson and his staff. Ken is also an instrument-rated private pilot.

Ken first visited the Estrella Warbird Museum in the early spring of 2006. He was impressed with our museum but found one thing missing --- air-toair missiles! So through his contacts and that of Ben McRee (retired Hughes Program Manager of the AIM-120 AMRAAM missile program) and Ed Cobleigh (retired Hughes air-to-air Missile Marketing Manager), Ken has made arrangements for the museum to receive an AIM-7 Sparrow, AIM-9 Sidewinder and AIM-120 AMRAAM missile. An AIM-54 Phoenix missile will follow shortly. Ken also made a significant financial contribution to the construction of Freedom Hall.

During the dinner meeting of September 6th, we will have an unveiling of the three missiles followed by a presentation by Ken Richardson. Don't miss this talk by a senior executive of an aerospace company that played a major part in winning the Cold War.


