October 4 Program: "Honeymoon Town" of Marilyn Monroe and Joe DiMaggio

Gary J. McMaster is Curator for the Camp Roberts Historical Museum

McMaster has been designing and building exhibits for the museum, manages the gift shop and handles a myriad of other projects.

Born in western New York State, he was brought up in San Diego. He entered the US Army in 1965, later served in the US Army Reserve as an amphibious operator, then as a full-time soldier with the National Guard, serving mostly with Armor units. McMaster was a supply sergeant for a tank company for ten years, then served as an Assistant Operations Sergeant and a Nuclear-Chemical-Biological NCO for a Mechanized Infantry Brigade. Was later a Truck Master for a Tank Battalion, and finished up 38 years of service as Operations Sergeant for Camp Roberts, retiring in 2003 as a Senior Noncommissioned Officer.

He now works for Engineering and Environment, Inc. under a National Guard Bureau contract—right back in Camp Roberts Operations—managing the computer programs for the scheduling of their ranges and training areas.

"I've always loved research and writing, and have written many published magazine and newspaper articles on various subjects. I have one legitimately published book--"The International Trout and Salmon Cookbook"-- which was published by a major publisher simultaneously in the U.S. and Great Britain in 1970. I also wrote a lengthy treatise on the origins of the McMasters in Scotland, which was published as the center article in the quarterly journal of the Scottish Genealogy Society in Edinburgh, Scotland awhile back. I write as a hobby, so I'm likely to write on just about anything that strikes my fancy."

For the last 15 years he's been a rifleman in a Regimental Museum-sanctioned commemorative team that recreates The Gordon Highlanders--a Scottish Infantry regiment in the British Armyduring their days in Egypt in the 1880's. With original uniforms, rifles, Gatling guns and cannons, they recreate period battles at Scottish Highland Games and Victorian Festivals throughout the State. He has performed three tours in Scotland, where he vacations every year, taking side trips elsewhere in Europe while there.

JONES, Lewis Carriker (Pinky)

Solvang resident Lewis C. "Pinky" Jones, died on September 12, 2006 at his home.

Pinky was 85, born on December 26, 1920, in

Norton, VA, to Claude and Pearl (Carriker) Jones. He graduated from Unicoi County High School and attended East Tennessee State Teachers College prior to entering the United States Army Air Corps in 1941.

He served a distinguished career in the Air Force as a bomber Pilot, commanding a number of Strategic Air Command units, until his retirement in 1967 at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Continuing his lifelong passion for aviation, he enjoyed a full second career in corporate aviation, flying Lear Jets until his second and third retirements in 1986. Pinky continued flying actively as a private pilot through age 84. The Federal Aviation Administration awarded him the Wright Brothers "Master Pilot" Award for over 50 years of service, expertise, professionalism and outstanding contributions toward aviation safety in June, 2006. Throughout his life, he was active in a number of aviation and civic altruistic organizations, including the Daedalians, the Quiet Birdmen, and the Vikings.

Pinky resided in Solvang since 1983. In his final years of life, he continued to enjoy flying, travel, his association with the Estrella Warbird Museum in Paso Robles and charitable work with the Vikings. Pinky was preceded in death by his wife, Jean, in 2002. He is survived by his son Greg of Denver, Colorado; daughter Cindy of San Diego, California; son Tom of Fairfax, VA; grandchildren Chris, Corey, and Dalton; and sister Sharlotte Jones Rynders of Erwin, Tennessee.

Conrad "Marty" Martin, age 74, left us Friday, Sept. 8, 2006, to fly with the angels. Marty was born on July 6, 1932, in Norfolk, Va. A celebration of his life took place on Sept. 15, 2006, at Crosspoint Community Church, 1265 W. McCoy Lane, Santa Maria.

Marty grew up in New Hope, Ala., Youngstown, Ohio, and Long Beach, Calif. After high school, he became a full-time California National Guardsman, and served a tour of active duty in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. He became an Army reservist, retiring in 1992. In 1962, he moved to the Central Coast to work for Lockheed at Vandenberg AFB. Marty retired from Lockheed in 1994. Marty lived in Nipomo for much of his life and was very involved with his church and community. Retirement opened the door for his love of aviation. Marty was involved in numerous aviation associations, including the Estrella Warbird Museum. 


