Dorothy Renton McBain

Dorothy Renton McBain, Life Member of Lightening Flight and Thunderbolt Flight passed away Thursday, November 16 at Twin Cities Community Hospital at the age of 97.

Dorothy was an enthusiastic member of the Warbird family and had been looking forward to the completion of Freedom Hall. Dorothy was a professional pianist and singer and was well known in music circles in southern California and the central coast. She began piano lessons at the age of 3 and made her debut with the Pasadena Civic Orchestra playing the Grieg Concerto in her early teens.


Her career as a piano solist expanded into vocalist after she met a handsome young tenor named Arthur Renton, who was taking voice lessons from the vocal teacher she worked for. They began performing as a duo act and married in March of 1942 after Arthur joined the US Army Air Corps.

After the end of WW II, Arthur and Dorothy took their 5 year old daughter, Betty, and went to Milan, Italy for 2 ½ years to study opera. They did a 6 month concert tour of West Germany at the end of their stay in Italy, finally returning to the US where they continued performing with the Riverside Opera Company, and Los Angeles Light Opera Company.

In 1956 hey settled in Atascadero, where Arthur's family had a 1500 acre ranch (Rancho Santa Catalina) and opened a music store there. After selling the music store they opened Paso Robles Travel Service in 1965. Arthur passed away in 1979 and Dorothy moved back to southern California where she married Don McBain in 1984. Don and Dorothy moved to Paso Robles in 1992 and Don joined the Estrella Warbirds. Don passed away in 1997. Dorothy moved back to Atascadero in 2003 and lived with Betty and Chuck Miller until her passing.
