CAMP ROBERTS HISTORICAL MUSEUM

* * FEBRUARY UPDATE * *

The Museum is coordinating a fund drive to convince local businesses to join the Camp Roberts Historical Museum Foundation as Corporate Life Members for \$1,000 each. It looks like we need to raise some serious money if we are go get the Main Museum re-

Proposed concept of a memorial to honor veterans, provide an income source to supplement museum expenses, to complement and sustain membership growth, and increase Freedom Hall visits is being developed. --Obbie

roofed and get a new heating and air conditioning system in it. We also have to raise money to get all of the Camp Roberts newspapers from WWII and the Korean War digitalized and preserved. We would also like to get one of the restrooms in the Main Museum renovated into a handicapped accessible restroom. Even now--as we are in the final stage of just getting this fund drive off the ground--we have already received one such membership for Loya Electrical Construction, Inc. of Cordelia, California, and another one from the Caspar W. Weinberger Foundation of Mt. Desert, Maine. Mr. Caspar W. Weinberger, Jr., who was so instrumental in making our exhibit on his late father a reality, is Executive Director of that foundation. He is also writing a letter to go along with our packets to businesses urging their support.

I have recently convinced some notable people to become members of a Board of Chancellors for the Museum that I am forming. Lieutenant General Herbert R. Temple, Jr., USA (Ret), former Chief of the National Guard Bureau, has agreed to become a board member, as has Brigadier General Glenn E. Muggelberg, USA (Ret), who was the first National Guard Commander of Camp Roberts. Arlen Weinberger, daughter of the late Secretary of Defense. has also agreed to be on the Board, as has Capt. Dale Dye, USMC (Ret). Dye is a highly-decorated Vietnam Veteran and an actor who has appeared in Saving Private Ryan, Band of Brothers, Platoon and other films. He hosted and narrated an episode of The Conquerors for the History Channel at our Museum a while back. I am also trying to contact R. Lee "Gunny" Ermey to see if he will agree to be on this Board. The Chancellery is not involved in the day-today activities of the Museum, but rather is an advisory board to support and represent the Museum in various sectors of American life.

The widow of Brigadier General Robert Elder had her daughter drive her up last week from her home in Santa Barbara to visit the Museum and see the recent exhibit on her late husband. He was a combat vet of both WWII and the Korean War (Silver and Bronze Stars), later Asst. Commander of the 40th Division and Commander of the 40th Separate Brigade. She was real pleased with the exhibit in our Korean War Room and had a very pleasant tour of the Museum.



We now have the antique-style Stereoscope I spoke of in the last Update, as part of the Corporal Harold Roberts area. Visitors now can peer at an original WWI-period 3D stereo view of Renault tanks heading to the Front--like the Renault in which our namesake spent the final days of his young life.

The WWII Research and Preservation Society recently made a donation of \$500 to the Museum. Jim Camarillo, head of the group, also donated two complete WWII German uniforms (Afrika Corps and SS) for our WWII Axis Exhibit. They are original and complete with field gear, helmets, weapons, bayonet, etc. One of the tunics was used in Saving Private Ryan. These are very valuable sets and you will see them on new mannequins in an upgraded exhibit soon. In the future we plan a fully fitted-out Japanese WWII soldier as well.

We now have large pieces of the Berlin Wall on exhibit in the Main Museum, thanks to the donation of SGT Brad Snively who got them as a soldier stationed in Germany when people first began tearing down the wall. You may have seen our items from Saddam's Palace at Babylon brought to us by a veteran of OIF. We should also soon have pieces of Hitler's Eagle's Nest on exhibit. I love to get unique pieces of history like this that you will not see at a museum anywhere else!

Special thanks go out to Mike Kelley and Paul Zemke. We now have three nice legal-size filing cabinets so we can reorganize all of our historical photograph and document files in the Museum office. This is very important in providing proper and adequate storage for the archival history of Camp Roberts.

Doug Miner, R.I.P.

Warbirder G.D. Doug Miner, 82, of Paso Robles, died on Tuesday, February 13, 2007, at a local hospital.

Miner was born June 11, 1924, in Berkeley and raised in Richmond, Upon completion of high school he joined the Naval Aviation Cadet Program, received his Navy wings in 1944, and served as a naval aviator in WWII until 1945. He attended San Francisco State College, graduating in 1949. He worked in broadcasting in the Bay Area until he was recalled during the Korean Conflict in 1952 and served in the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Radio Information Department, and the Naval Photo Center in Anacortia, D.C. Subsequently he served as the first Public Affairs Officer in Spain during the establishment of the Naval base in Rota, Spain.

Upon his discharge from the Navy he began a 30-year career with Lockheed Missiles and Space Company in Sunnyvale, where he was a lead engineer until retiring in 1987.

Miner has lived in Paso Robles since 1988 and was an active member of Kiwanis, Paso Robles Elks Lodge No. 2364, Estrella Warbird Museum, a docent for the Pioneer Museum and a member of the Paso Robles Golf and County Club.

He was preceded in death by his sons Gregg and Grant, and wives Gladys and Peg. He is survived by his son, George D. Miner III and wife Sue; daughter Constance Villa and husband Raymond; five grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and his companion Jean Coulson.

At his request, no service will be held. Burial will be at Arlington National Cemetery, in Arlington, Va.

In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to the Estrella Warbird Museum or the Pioneer Museum in Paso Robles.


