Lt. Com. Bill Hale, USN, EWM member recalls his service: WWII, Korea, Vietnam -- racks up 82 Combat Flights

Bill Hale, our own Estrella Warbird Museum member, joined the US Navy six weeks after turning 17 during World War II. Bill volunteered for, and was accepted for flying duty and went to Navy Radioman School. He was then ordered to Bombing Squadron Nine (VB-9) as a crewman Radioman/Gunner.

That squadron was part of Air Group Nine embarked on USS Essex (CV-9), the first carrier of that class deployed to the Pacific in early 1943. During that tour his outfit was involved in 13 engagements. including invasions Tarawa, Kwajalien, Marshall Islands and Saipan. The ship and Air Group was awarded the Presidential Unit Citation. They returned to the Continental United States (Conus) in late March 1944.

Bill was then assigned to Bombing 12 of Air Group Twelve and returned to the PACIFIC aboard The USS Randolph (CV-15). In January 1945 their first target was the home lands of Japan. His group was also at the invasion of Iwo Jima and Okinawa where the ship was hit by a Kamikaze in March of 1945. The ship was repaired, continued in combat and came home in early August 1945. Bill celebrated VJ day at home on "survivors leave." Following WW2 he chose to stay in the Navy and served at several different Naval Air Stations both in the US and overseas.

In 1950 when the Korean War broke out Bill volunteered for combat duty and was transferred to Japan. During his year there he provided support to those flying combat. In 1956 he was promoted to Ensign and returned to flying as a Naval Air Observer, which later changed to Naval Flight Officer (NFO). Bill then did a 2-year exchange tour with the English Navy and also flew combat in Vietnam.

Bill attained the rank of Lieutenant Commander and was selected as the first non-pilot to be an Officer-in-Charge (OIC) of a Detachment of 4 aircraft, 24 officers and 127 enlisted men operating from deployed carriers. Bill's final tour of Naval duty was as an Avionics Systems Project Officer in the Naval Bureau of Aeronautics, Washington D.C.

During his career Bill Hale flew 38 combat flights during WW II and 44 combat flights in Vietnam. His decorations include a Distinguished Flying Cross, 8 Air Medals, a Commendation Medal, a Presidential Unit Citation, an Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal and various theatre medals.

During his talk Bill will tell a story about one of the games they played with an Admiral during a dining out. Sometime during the affair the Admiral changed uniform jackets with the most junior man in the bar and then went around and asked anyone to hit him in his belly! Bill will tell you what happened next when he speaks to our museum on the night of May 2th


