#### COLONEL WILLIAM J. HATCH

Colonel William J. Hatch has served in a variety of command and staff assignments in the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division (Mechanized), 2<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division, 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division (Air Assault), 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division, 3<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Division (Mechanized), and the 7<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division. Overseas assignments include two tours in Korea, one tour in Germany and command of an attack helicopter battalion (AH64) during Operation Desert Storm.

Key assignments include S-3, 2/101<sup>st</sup> Aviation Regiment; S-3, 4<sup>th</sup> Brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division; Commander, 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Aviation Regiment; and Chief of Army Aviation, Combined Forces Command and Eighth Army, Republic of Korea. From 1996 to 1999, he served as the Senior Regular Army Advisor to The Adjutant General for the State of California.

After joining the California National Guard in 1999, Colonel Hatch served as the Director of the Soldier Team Training Center and Post Commander, Camp San

Luis Obispo until February 2003 followed by his assignment as Post Commander of Camp Roberts until July 2004. Currently, Colonel Hatch is the Program Manager for the Joint Training and Experimentation Program (JTEP).

His awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Bronze Star Medal, Méritorious Service Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, Air Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Senior Aviator Badge, Parachutist Badge, and Ranger Tab.

Locally, Colonel Hatch is engaged in a number of civic activities as a member of the Atascadero Kiwanis, and on the Board of Directors of the San Luis Obispo County Red Cross. He and his family are members of the St Williams Parish in Atascadero.

Colonel Hatch and his wife, Ann, have one son, Bill, who is a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps, and two daughters, Ashley and India. Colonel Hatch and his family reside in Atascadero, California.

Cambria Historical Society Report: Guthrie-Bianchini House

There has been a lot of construction activity at the Guthrie-Bianchini House in the last two months and much of it is visible from the outside. The roof has been completed with fireresistant redwood shingles very similar to the ones that were on the house a hundred years ago before the red and green composition roof was put on over it. Grading of the front (Burton Drive) yard and the handicap accessible walkway from the parking lot to the front yard is complete. Road base has been put in where the paths will be and bricks will be installed soon. Conduits for electrical and plumbing have been installed under the locations of the brick walkways. The remaining siding on the east and north sides of the house has been completed and work is proceeding on the porches and the porch roofs.

On the inside, the redwood boards which had to be removed from the inside walls to install the shear wall panels have been milled down and replaced in their original positions rendering the plywood sheets in the walls invisible. CHS recently uncovered a photograph of the parlor dating from the early 1900s which clearly shows the oil-burning chandelier which was there. We have located a nearly identical chandelier which runs on electricity and it will be installed in the parlor.

When CHS acquired the house, we found that the trim inside the house was made of Cambria pine and redwood and had a grain painted on it to make it appear to be oak. We have located a "faux painter" who can do this technique and she has completed all of the interior trim.




