January 9: "A prisoner of Stalag Luft IV"

Title: "Son Writes About his Father who was Shot Down and Captured in WWII and held Prisoner in Stalag Luft IV"

David Dorfmeier was born in Fresno in 1948 and is currently employed with the Department of the Army providing a variety of clinical counseling services to active duty soldiers and their family members.

He has a Master's degree in Psychology & Counseling from the University of Northern Colorado and completed a two-year postgraduate Marriage & Family Training Program with the Menninger Clinic in Topeka, Kansas in 1977.

David, a Sergeant Major in the Army Reserve, is also a Vietnam veteran who has a personal and professional interest in working with soldiers suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.

David is currently finishing a book project started by his father. SGT Donald Dorfmeier, 398th Bomb Group, who was shot down on his third mission over Germany on August 4, 1944. For the past eight years he has been working to finish his father's initial effort to chronicle. his experiences POW at Stalag Luft IV, participation in the 86 day "hunger march" across northern Germany and lastly, escaping with four other men in early April 1945. His father started his writing endeavor in June 1964 and hoped to publish his memoirs that summer. Now 43 years later, David has completed 18 of 25 chapters of a more expansive overarching project to honor his father's memory, characterize the life- altering

impact war and how these influences have shaped his values and the course of his own [Because my February speaker is in the Army Reserve and will be departing our area in late January, I have moved him to the January 9th slot and moved Harold Bauer to February 6th.]


Soledad High School ASB/Class Officers Visit..
