Dan Paves, a resident of Cayucos, California, served in the U.S. Air Force from November 1960 to May 1964. After attending radar school Paves was assigned to the 775th Radar Squadron in Cambria, California.

The mission of the squadron was to detect incoming Russian bombers over the Pacific Ocean and guide Air Force jets to intercept them. He was on duty during the Cuban Missile Crisis of October 1962.

In January 1963 Paves was reassigned to the 937th Radar Squadron at Homer, Alaska and was 50-feet underground when a 9.2 Richter earthquake struck Alaska.

Paves completed his military service in 1964. He worked for Allstate Insurance for five years before entering independent insurance agency business. He spent 40 years in the insurance business prior to retirement and still does some consulting work.

Paves has been married for 45 years and has four children, three of whom are engineers. He has lived on the California Central Coast for 12 years and now lives only ten miles from his old 775th Radar Squadron location. He says, "What goes around, comes around."






