
### Wednesday, September 3 Speaker--Tomas Akers

Tomas Akers was a sophomore in Cal Poly's engineering department when he decided to stay in San Luis Obispo after graduation. So, he teamed up with Norm Timbs, a Cal Poly engineering alum and fellow model sailplane enthusiast, to start a company that produces unmanned aerial vehicles. (UAV's)

The pair founded Aeromech Engineering nine years ago, using only their personal savings and credit cards. They began with less than \$1,000 in start-up cash, Akers recalled. "Norm already had a shop in his garage with the necessary tools for us to get started, so that helped a fair bit," he said.

The company has experienced significant growth since then, now employing 85 people and occupying 45,000 square feet in an industrial area of San Luis Obispo. Aeromech employees work on a host of projects for the U.S. military and major defense companies including Lockheed Martin.

The airplanes that Aeromech produces are like "an eye in the sky" for soldiers and bases that need protection from ambushes and attacks, Akers said. The company also makes target drones – jet-engine-powered versions of unmanned air vehicles – used to test radar systems and missiles.

Aeromech, Akers said, is one of the larger producers of small-unmanned aircraft in the nation. "There are a few companies that produce more than we do on an annual basis, but we are definitely on the upper end of the scale," he noted.



### M.A.S.H. Mural ... About the Muralist, Gerri O'Brien

Gerri O'Brien showed early signs of artistic talent. According to her mother, "She could draw before she could walk, and even painted her first mural at age two... on my new white dresser... with my new red lipstick!"

Throughout High School, all of O'Brien's electives were in Art. She sold her first commissioned portrait at age 16. Her art training continued over the next several years through: The fine Arts Program at Orange Coast College, The L.A. Art Students' League under Joyce Pike and Hal Reed, and the International Portrait Seminars in New York with John Howard Sanden.

In her late twenties as a wife, and mother of three young sons, she began teaching oil painting, as well as continuing to paint client commissions. All in all, O'Brien has about 35 years experience in the art field. 14 years ago, this experience took a new direction: Murals.

Murals have become her most rewarding means of expression. "The deadlines are short, the subjects are vast and varied, and the opportunities for learning and growth are challenging!" A constant desire to learn more and bring more to the work has brought her to her love for travel. Specifically, travel in Europe.

"Even though I had studied (from books) and painted from the work of the masters of the High Renaissance period for years, nothing has influenced the quality of my work as profoundly as experiencing these wonderful masterpieces in full scale and in situ. Viewing the artwork on walls, ceilings, and canvases of palaces, villas, residences and civic/religious buildings has made a permanent imprint on my soul. The phrase 'waiting to exhale' doesn't *begin* to describe the feeling I experienced. Awe, wonder, deep appreciation, and a fresh dose of humility, *does*.

Infused with new inspiration, I now seek to *paint from the heart*. My heart belongs to the Master Artist, the Lord Jesus Christ. The very One who gave me, not just the talent but, the opportunity, the health, the will, and the ability to do what I'm doing."

With constant challenges of painting new and diverse subjects, and with the fluctuations in the economy, O'Brien confesses that both fear and anxiety, do visit her on occasion. "There's a passage in the Bible that instructs me, not just in life, but in Art as well: Phil. 4:687 • 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.'

And when I finish a painting that is especially lovely, I stand back in amazement and say, 'Wow, Lord, thank you so much for enabling me to do that!"


#### IS THIS AN EGYPTIAN PYRAMID?


