




October Speaker:

Ray Johnson

Ray Johnson was born and raised in Ripon, California, and graduated from Ripon High School. After graduation from Modesto Junior College he entered the Navy Flight Training program as a Naval Aviation Cadet (NAVCAD) in January 1958. He received his wings and commission in July 1959. Ray was designated as Navy Helicopter pilot #4822.



Ray entered a San Diego fleet squadron in 1959, and began flying the HSS-1 helicopter(later named the SH-34). He was among the first to begin night dipping (hovering in order to lower a sonar dome) as the automated approach/hover system in the H-34 was introduced to the fleet. In 1963 Ray was among the first fleet pilots to transition to the twin jet engine Sikorsky SH-3. He later became an SH-3 instructor in the Fleet Replacement Squadron.

After a tour on a Carrier Division as an Admiral's aide, he attended the Naval War College school of Command and Staff. Early in 1970, he joined Helicopter Combat Support Squadron 7 stationed in Atsugi, Japan with regular deployments to Viet Nam as a combat search and rescue pilot flying off carriers and DLGs in the Gulf of Tonkin.

After a staff tour in Washington, D.C., Ray was part of the commissioning crew of HSL-34, a Light Airborne Multi Purpose (LAMPS) squadron in Norfolk, VA. Ray was the first executive officer and the second commanding officer of that squadron, flying the Kaman SH-2 Sea Sprite.

Ray retired from the Navy in 1979, following a tour as a member of the Navy's development team for the current H-60. After his retirement Ray was the Center Director of a retreat center in Pennsylvania, a business consultant on the Central Coast of California and retired in 2005 as the president/CEO of San Luis Obispo Economic Vitality Corporation. Ray served eight years on the Atascadero City Council, three of those years as the mayor. Ray and his wife Helen have three children and eleven grand children.


Because Docents need time off due to illness, vacation, unexpected events we always need to have more Docents. We currently have the following shifts to cover each week of the month:

Museum Musings.....Betty Miller

What exactly *does* a "Curator" do? Well, here at the Estrella Warbird Museum your **two** Freedom Hall Curators wear many hats.


Your two Curators are responsible for obtaining items of interest, researching each donated item to ensure validity, maintaining those items, keeping all the legal paperwork current, changing displays when necessary, returning loaned items that are no longer needed for display, maintaining the computer data base, photographing each item in the Museum's collection, working with the Public Information Officer to ensure publicity is obtained for new items of interest, as well as for the Museum, raising funds to obtain major works (such as the MASH Mural just completed) putting together and hosting Dedication events (Mural Dedication coming up), coordinating tour activities for outside groups, working with other Museums in the county, obtaining display cases, maintaining safe and secure storage areas for items not currently on display, and keeping the Board of Directors informed of progress in the Museum growth.

In addition the Curators must maintain close contact with the Docents as well as the Gift Shop Manager and Gift Shop volunteer staff, and the Research Librarian and Library Volunteers. Most Museums have many people on their staff, both paid and volunteer, to handle each area. As you know, this Museum is all volunteer, with no paid staff. At the moment the two Curators are handling the load. Happily, we will soon add another volunteer, Karen Lamas, to do some of the Data Entry for the Museum's computer program - "Past Perfect"- to ease some of this load.

To add more paperwork, one of the major Donor misconceptions has been that all donated items will be displayed indefinitely. We certainly recognize that people who donate something wish to have it preserved and seen by visitors. Because we are limited space-wise and have many more items than could be put out on display (in some cases more than one item of the same thing) we **cannot guarantee** when your donation will be on display, or for how long it will be displayed. Our early "Proffer of Gift Forms" were not done by recognized national museum standards and had some confusing verbiage. We are now required as members of the AASLH (American Association of State & Local History) to contact all donors from 1997 to 2007 and have those Donors complete our new required "Deed of Gift" form which will supersede the former "Proffer of Gift Form", Many of you will be receiving these new forms with a clarifying letter.

Should you receive the new form and letter, please complete and return it promptly. If you have questions you may contact Betty Miller at 805-471-0472. In the meantime, Carol Weiss and I will continue working to keep your Museum one of the best in the west!
