## FREEDOM FLIGHT VETERANS MEMORIAL NEWS





#### Museum Musings by Betty Miller

If you have not seen the new M.A.S.H. Mural in Freedom Hall come on in and check it out!

The <u>Chaplain's Exhibit</u> is back in place and honors the men and women who serve their country by providing spiritual support to our service men and women in the field as well as at home. Together with the Medics and Corpsmen, they make a valuable support team for our military. During WW II four US Army Chaplains exemplified the highest degree of dedication and courage of Chaplains.


Rev. George L. Fox (Methodist) Rabbi Alexander D. Goode (Jewish), Rev. Clark V. Poling (Reformed Church in America), and Fr. John P. Washington (Roman Catholic) joined the US Army as Chaplains. In 1942, the chaplains attended Chaplains School at Harvard University and became fast friends. In January 1943, the chaplains embarked on board the *USAT Dorchester*, which was transporting over 900 soldiers to the United Kingdom by way of Greenland.

On February 2, 1943 the German submarine U-223 spotted the convoy on the move and closed with the ships, firing a torpedo which struck the *Dorchester* shortly after midnight. Hundreds of men packed the decks of the rapidly sinking ship and scrambled for the lifeboats. Several of the lifeboats had been damaged and the four chaplains began to organize the frightened soldiers. They distributed life jackets and when the supply ran out gave their own lifejackets to others. When the last boats were away, the chaplains prayed with those unable to escape the sinking ship. 27 minutes after the torpedo struck, the *Dorchester* slipped below the waves with 672 men still aboard. The last view the survivors had of the four chaplains, they were standing on the deck, arms linked and praying together.




On January 18, 1961, President John F. Kennedy posthumously presented the Four Chaplain's Medal for Heroism to the families of the four men. The front of the gold oval-shaped medal depicts an eagle grasping olive branches in both talons. The eagle represents the majesty of the spirit of the government in whose service the Four Chaplains gave the last full measure of devotion. The olive branches symbolize spiritual peace and renascence. On . the back of the medal is an open book with the names of the Four Chaplains. Above the left side of the book is a cross and above the right side are the Tablets of Moses with a Star of David. The Christian Cross and the Star of David represent the faiths of the Four Chaplains. An olive wreath extends upward from the base representing peace.

Your museum has many other interesting stories and unique artifacts. We continue to add new things and we would like to have you visit and volunteer to be a part of this exciting growth. At this time of Thanksgiving with your friends and family, take time to remember our service men and women, many far from home, family and friends.
