Not only has it turned out better than expected, the original concept has been expanded to include more vehicles and displays. A grand opening is already being planed and scheduled along with WarBirds, Wings & Wheels II, coming in May 2010.

Glen Thomson and the Gooney Bird Group have finished a 26 month restoration of the C-47, "Betsy's Biscuit Bomber." The first day it flew, we had numerous new visitors to the museum who saw her fly over the city and they just had to come out to see this grand old bird! The Ryan Firebee has finished restoration and proudly sits on display with it bright new red coat while it awaits the painting of a new acquisition, the Fouga Magister.

This week, Gary Corippo will lead a team down to Mojave to retrieve portions of a new aircraft, something different, a Swedish supersonic fighter jet, which will soon call Estrella Warbirds Museum, home. Something started last February is now taking shape in the Brooks Building. Before the next dinner, you should be able to view a new and rather extensive munitions display, which will highlight many of the munitions used during World War II.

But it is not just new artifact displays or new aircraft. During October, we will be installing a state of the art security system, which, unfortunately is a necessity as the museum continues to grow and acquire priceless artifacts of times gone by. We continue to abide by the rule, nothing is installed or built unless it has been paid for. A world of thanks goes out to those whom have assisted financially with their generous donations allowing us to continue to move forward.

But that's not all! During the past month, your board of directors has worked unselfishly together, to establish written guidelines and re-enforce old ones, to insure that the 501(c)3 non-profit status of the museum stays in tact as we continue preserve the artifacts of the past for the benefit of current and future generations. You should be proud of them. I am! They do good work!

October 7 Program— Charles (Norm) Stevens will talk about his experiences as a B-17 bombardier in the 8th Air Force during WWII.

Charles N. (Norm) Stevens will be our guest speaker on October 7th. He is the author of *An Innocent at Pole-brook*. Norm grew up in Inglewood, California. At 18 he joined the Army Air Corps, serving during World War II from April 1943 until October 1946. He flew as a bombardier on a B-17 in the 8th Air Force, 351st Bomb Group, at Polebrook, England during the summer and fall of 1944. His tour of duty consisted of 34 bombing missions over Germany and occupied France, Belgium and Holland. He is a recipient of the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal.

Following the war he graduated from UCLA with a bachelor's degree in psychology. He was a teacher in secondary schools for 32 years, primarily in Montebello, California. His subjects were science and, after earning a master's degree in English at California State College at Los Angeles, English and American Literature.

His new book, *The Innocent Cadet* about his training before going overseas into combat has recently been published.

Norm lives with his wife, Dolores Seidman, in Monterey Park, California where they have resided for 37 years. Both books, *An Innocent at Polebrook* and *The Innocent Cadet* will be available for sale and signing both before and after the meeting for \$15 each.

Meridith Love, and Nancy Spizer who were the winners of the door prize drawings we held en-route to the Presidential Library.


It is always a great experience traveling with EWM members. I look forward to our next adventure and will be researching a new destination for us to visit.

conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty:



Staff Sergeant Jared C. Monti distinguished himself by acts of gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty while serving as a team leader with Headquarters and Headquarters Troop, 3d Squadron, 71st Cavalry Regiment, 3d Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, in connection with combat operations against an armed enemy in Nuristan Province, Afghanistan, on June 21, 2006.

A On June 21, 2006, while Staff Sergeant Monti was leading a mission aimed at gathering intelligence and directing fire against the enemy, his 16-man patrol was attacked by as many as 50 enemy fighters. On the verge of being overrun, Staff Sergeant Monti quickly directed his men to set up a defensive position behind a rock formation. He then called for indirect fire support, accurately targeting the rounds upon the enemy who had closed to within 50 meters of his position. While still directing fire, Staff Sergeant Monti personally engaged the enemy with his rifle and a grenade, successfully disrupting an attempt to flank his patrol. Staff Sergeant Monti then realized that one of his Soldiers was lying wounded in the open ground between the advancing enemy and the pa-A trol's position. With complete disregard for his own safety, Staff Sergeant Monti twice attempted to move from behind the cover of the rocks into the face of relentless enemy fire to rescue his fallen comrade. Determined not to leave his Soldier, Staff Sergeant Monti made a third attempt to cross open terrain through intense enemy fire. On this final attempt, he was mortally wounded, sacrificing his own life in an effort to save his fellow Soldier.

Staff Sergeant Monti's selfless acts of heroism inspired his patrol to fight off the larger enemy force. Staff Sergeant Monti's immeasurable courage and uncommon valor are in keeping with the highest traditions of military service and reflect great credit upon himself, Headquarters and Headquarters Troop, 3rd Squadron, 71st Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, and the United States Army.

MUSEUM MUSING

The Estrella Warbird Museum continues to receive some extraordinary artifact donations. The most recent include a large collection of WW II Armed Forces Radio transcription discs and the unique 1930's professional turntable to play them on, plus a collection of photos from a CBI pilot who flew many types of aircraft during his service in WWII.

The recording were valued at \$1100 to \$1500 a few years ago and include speeches from President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Abbott and Costello in "Whose on First", as well as several bands and entertainers from 1940-1945. The discs are 24" in diameter and require a special non-metal needle, so we are researching sources to obtain some so that we can take the best of the collection and pout them on CD's for preservation. Ron Brooks will be working on the professional turntable to get it back in shape.

Storage of artifacts is always an issue and we will be continuing to rotate items a couple of times a year to be able to display many of these unique items. Like most museums, we will never have enough space to display everything we have in our collection, but the positive side to this is the fact that we always have "new" items on display that people who visited six months ago have never seen before. Many museums have things in storage that have been there for 30+ years.

Since I will be incapacitated for a period following foot surgery September 21, I would ask all would-be Donors to complete a "Temporary Custody Receipt" and call me at home for instruction on what to do with items that they wish to have the Museum consider for acceptance.






