

## "Thoughts From the Flight Line" Musings by the President, Peter Visel

During the past several months, I've been on a wake-up call. It was something about our guest speaker's presentation in October that opened my eyes to the reality of World War II and the reason that generation has been called the "Greatest Generation" ever. It became personal to me. I was struck by the vast amount (literally) of aircraft expended and lives lost in the battle for freedom of not just the United States, but the world. Several days following the presentation, I received via email, a copy of a personal flight log for a WW II co-pilot detailing all 25 of his missions during bombing raids over the cities of Germany. I was struck in awe of the personal ordeals he went through from the crippling cold endured, the intense, gripping faces of death, and the shear number, not tens nor


hundreds, but thousands of aircraft and crews sent out on individual missions

During this past week, I was again mesmerized while watching the History Channel's series of WWII in HD. It was no longer history that was to be read from a book, packed on a shelf and forgotten about, but once again, it brought home the grim reality that the personal memories of the horrors of conflict and war remain with the participants the rest of their lives. Much of what happens while fighting for freedom, never makes the news media. It remains in the hearts and minds of those who were there for a lifetime. Estrella Warbirds Museum is very fortunate that many have chosen to share those memories with us and leave for us to display for future generations, those items or artifacts that were personal to them during conflict.

It is with this vein of thought that I extend my deepest appreciation to everyone who has played a role in developing and progressing Estrella Warbirds Museum. It is critical that we keep our mission in the forefront at all times, dedicated to the restoration and preservation of military aircraft, vehicles and memorabilia of those who flew the aircraft or worked on or around them. Our greatest strength is not to glorify conflict, but rather to make a future generation aware of the fact that our way of life does not come without extreme sacrifice. The results of our endeavors will always be a reminder to our children and grandchildren with the hopes that there is no need to repeat history but to learn from the realities of the past.

# December 2 Program— Gary Ryan The Joy of the Banjo "You can't help but smile when Gary's on Stage" By George Marrett, Program Chairman

Gary Ryan, banjoist extraordinaire, gifted pianist, pilot and builder of aircraft, airshow announcer, licensed cruise boat captain and artist, former candidate for the Presidency, and successful entrepreneur will be our speaker at the December dinner. Gary has been playing a banjo since a young boy and made his show business debut while in the eighth grade. Of that experience, Gary says, "Showtime arrived and I sat

down and played 'The World is Waiting for the Sunrise,' a then popular song by Les Paul and Mary Ford. The crowd loved it and clapped and cheered. They wanted an encore. Encore? I'd just played the only song I knew . . But the lesson was learned. If you want to dazzle your audience, you'd better know more than one tune!" Gary has since learned more than one tune. His musical journey has taken him from Berkeley to Denver to Las Vegas and beyond and, of course, to Morro Bay where for 14 years he was captain of the riverboat bay cruiser and its chief musician, a "gig" that was supposed to last "just for the summer."

Gary has played with the Great American Jazz Band at festivals across the nation and is a "roving ambassador" for the Mammoth Jazz Festival along with Philip Smith of the Stevie Wonder Band and they still play at events up and down the west coast. He is a recording artist and has been called "a jack of all trades and master of all."

Charlie Brown once said, "Everybody should have a banjo." Gary will show you why!

# **MUSEUM MUSING**

New Painting in Freedom Hall: We have just received an awesome acrylic painting of a P-38 over the White Cliffs of Dover by Cayucos artist, Mel Wysock. Mr Wysock has previously donated 6 other paintings of aircraft that are currently hung in Freedom Hall. This large painting really is an eye-popping, must-see addition to the P-38 exhibit, so be sure to come in and check it out soon!

Originally from Chicago where he attended the American Academy of Art, Wysock later went to the Illinois Institute of Technology to study Mechanical Engineering until he was drafted to serve during the Korean War. The military sent him to Fort Belvoir Engineering School to study Civil Engineering. Wysock was stationed at Beale AFB in California and Elmendorf AFB in Alaska, as a Civil Engineer.

After his discharge from the military, Mel Wysock owned an advertising company and was a partner in Super Speed Equipment Company, producers of racing equipment.

Best known for his paintings of cars, trains and airplanes, his work can be found from Germany to the South Pacific, and places like the Corvette Museum, Vandenburg AFB, Estero Bay Visitors Center, and now at the Estrella Warbird Museum!

*December Exhibit*: Many people born before 1935 can remember exactly where they were on Sunday, December 7, 1941. We will have an in-depth display with accompanying video commemorating Pearl Harbor day during the month of December.

Uniform Collection: The uniform collection has now been entered into the computer system. We have just been offered a WW II female Marine uniform belonging to a woman who served with the Marine Corps Woman's Reserve, which was reactivated in 1942 to free up men for combat duty. This will be an important addition to our WW II US Navy "Wave" uniform, once worn by Betty Rowe and our rare WASP dress uniform. We are now looking for a donation of a US Army "WAC" uniform, so if you are aware of one that might be donated, please call me!

We recently obtained the donation of a cedar chest from *Don and Aquilla Hart* which will be a great storage unit for some of our woolen items that can be folded. (Pullovers, overseas caps, etc.)

If you have or are aware of any items that you think we might like to obtain for the Museum, I request that all prospective Donors use my cell phone or home numbers (805-471-0472 & 805-466-1212) so that I can determine if the donation is unique or a duplicate of existing items already in storage. Some folks recently asked me why their donation was not on display. Museums always have items that are in storage awaiting a future exhibit. This keeps us from being static and offers something new to see for repeat visitors. With our limited space, we cannot always have everything out on display and some items are for research and may never be displayed, but are still very important to the Museum.

later remarked that he could have made more money that day dusting crops. He passed away in 1987 in his 80s.) And by the way, the plane that hits the truck and explodes? It's another plane--a wartime Boeing Model 75. Hitchcock bought the worn-out plane for the explosion for a few hundred dollars.




