

January 6, 2010 Dinner Program WW II Veteran Ernie Porter



Ernie Porter, 91, of Atascadero is a World War II veteran who this last Veteran's Day wanted to remember his lost squad, the young men who died at the battle of Okinawa more than 64 years ago. "I think it's important," Ernie said, "I was there and watched guys in front of me killed. I don't want them to have died for nothing."

Porter's story begins with his birth in Atascadero in 1918. He graduated from high school and then helped his dad repair roofs in Avenal. While there he took flying lessons at \$5 per hour usually in 10-15 minute intervals. He has 9 hours in his logbook. His flying stopped when he saw his instructor crash a biplane killing two women who were up for a joy ride.

By the time of his induction into the Army in 1943, he was married with two children and a third on the way. He trained at Camp Roberts as an infantryman, and then shipped out for Hawaii joining the 7th Infantry Division. By early 1945, the 7th Division had been earmarked for the upcoming invasion of Japan, starting with the seizure of the island of Okinawa.

Porter was injured in Okinawa in what his wife, Vera Alyce, said was "a million-dollar wound" because it resulted in Porter getting to go home to his family. Porter had been shot through the right side of his nose, the 25-caliber bullet passing behind his left eye, and exiting his left ear. Although critically injured he made his way back behind the enemy line under heavy machine gun fire with bullets kicking up at his feet.

War photographer Eugene Smith recorded Ernie's wounds, with the photos making their way into the Time Life Book, "The Road to Tokyo." The book shows an unidentified soldier lying on a stretcher with a bandaged face and foot. Porter's grandson, David Cruser, found the image while studying the war in school many years ago.

After the war Porter returned to Atascadero and became a lifeguard at the city lake. There he saved a lady from drowning. He still lives with his wife of 68-years in the house he built next to the lake. He also has a patent on an aircraft he designed. "I've lived a life of discovery," Porter says, "That's what's kept me going."

At the latest Veteran's Day ceremony, VFW Commander Larry Strang honored Ernie Porter as the recipient of the first Distinguished Veteran Award. "Ernie is a survivor. Lucky to be alive," said Strang, "Ernie Porter is certainly a gift to God, to our community, and to our nation."
