



## April 7 Program— Capt. Charlie Plumb Fighter Pilot, POW, and a Real American Hero

Captain Charlie Plumb graduated from the Naval Academy at Annapolis and went on to fly the F-4 Phantom jet on 74 successful combat missions over North Vietnam. On his 75th mission, with only five days before he was to return home, Plumb was shot down, captured, tor-

tured, and imprisoned in an 8 foot x 8 foot cell. He spent the next 2,103 days as a Prisoner Of War in communist prison camps.

During his nearly six years of captivity, Charlie Plumb distinguished himself among his fellow prisoners as a professional in underground communications, and served for two of those years as the Chaplain in his camp.

Since his return home, more than 4,000 audiences in nearly every industry have been spellbound as Captain Charlie Plumb draws parallels between his P.O.W. experience and the challenges of everyday life. He has shared his message to an even wider public through appearances on *Good Morning America*, *Nightline*, *Larry King Live*, and *The NewsHour with Jim Lehrer*. One of the most sought-after achievement speakers of his time, Charlie Plumbs presentations are as he is, sincere, straightforward, humorous, and tailored to motivate each specific audience he encounters.

Captain Plumb's Military honors include two Purple Hearts, the Legion of Merit, the Silver Star, the Bronze Star and the P.O.W. Medal.



### Former Champ Car and Silver Crown Champion George Snider Visits Woodland Hall



George Snider, center, who drove his way into the starting field for the Indy 500 twenty-three consecutive times and who won the 1971 USAC Silver Crown Championship and the 1981 USAC Champ Car Championship visited the EWM in March with longtime friend Dick Woodland. Dick is at the left and on the right is former Santa Maria Speedway Champion Jim Eiland. Jim drove the Patricia Woodland Offy #72 to victory in its last race and has helped Dick restore many of the cars on display in Woodland Hall.

## MOVIE BUFF'S QUIZ—THE ANSWERS

The original "Memphis Belle" is an F Model. The B-17 used in the film to portray her is a B-17G with its chin turret removed. It is owned by David Tallichet, who repainted it to match the real "Memphis Belle's livery. In the film, however, the paint scheme is not accurate because Warner Bros. lawyers were concerned about duplicating the original scheme.

Five real B-17s were used in filming "Memphis Belle." Two were flown in from the US, two came from France, and one was already based in England. One of the French aircraft crashed during the filming. Although everyone onboard survived, the aircraft was destroyed in the ensuing fire. Only one of the B-17s is an F Model like the "Memphis Belle." All of the others are the G Models that appeared later in the War.

Today the "Memphis Belle" is on display at the Air Force Museum outside of Dayton, Ohio. It was donated to the Museum by a Tennessee group that had displayed the aircraft in Memphis from 1987-2004, when the cost of maintaining the aircraft became too



high.


