

During the past month, the Estrella Warbirds Museum was notified that we would be receiving several "official" recognitions in the near future. The first is that the Museum will be recognized as an official "Purple Heart Trail" site along Highway 101. The purpose of the Purple Heart Trail is to create a symbolic and honorary system of roads, highways, bridges, and other monuments that give tribute to the men and women who have been awarded the Purple Heart medal. San Luis Obispo County is home to over 26,000 military veterans. Tim Haley, a Vietnam Veteran from Atascadero, has been leading the effort to get Purple Heart Trail

signs up on the Central Coast and was successful with enlisting Assemblyman Sam Blakeslee, to sponsor legislation which designates 115 mile stretch through parts of San Ardo south to Los Olivos. Camp Roberts, Estrella Warbirds Museum and the Atascadero Veterans Memorial are three locally recognized monuments noted along the Purple Heart Trail.

At 11 a.m., May 1st, at the entrance to Freedom Hall, the California Native Sons of the Golden West, will hold a ceremony recognizing the Estrella Warbirds Museum as a site known for preserving historical traditions and memorabilia within the state of California. Long before the state of California began preserving historical sites, in 1880s, the Native Sons of the Golden West had begun campaigns to save disintegrating historical buildings and icons around the state. It is indeed an honor and a humbling experience to receive these two designations.

Not to be out-done, the United States Army this past month formally notified the undersigned that they had officially recognized and designated the Estrella Warbirds Museum as an official site to receive excess and/or historical items from the US Army. This designation has been sought after for many years and comes only after the persistence of several members working behind the scenes in support of your museum. Congratulation to Betty Miller and Gary Corippo for helping to secure this designation!

Springtime brings many new activities! April 24th and 25th will see about 16 hot air balloons launched from the museum grounds. EWM member Jeff Quaid has organized a new event for this year, the Texan and Trojan Spring Round-Up held April 29th to May 1st. This event brings over a dozen historical AT6 and T-28 planes to the skies above Paso Robles. We know you will enjoy this outstanding event!

May 8th brings us the 2d Warbirds Wings and Wheels event. This year, we will be celebrating the grand opening of the Woodland Automobile Display Building with celebrity guest Parnelli Jones. The event features over 200 pristine classic automobiles among the warbirds along with an exceptional collection of historical racing automobiles. Also joining the display will be the recent National Championship Tractor Pull vehicles from Cal Poly. These awesome super-charged tractors will be on display. Plan on finding plenty of vendors, great food, music, awards, a USO event, and all-around family fun day during this Open House!

It has been amazing to watch the museum grow over the past several years. There are always new faces, new sites to see, new displays and plenty of activities. None of this could happen without a great group of volunteers having fun and working together for a common cause! If you are not involved, maybe its time you could spare a few hours each month to get to know some new friends? We would love to welcome you!

May 5 Program— Al Schade The Pacific War—The View from a Douglas SBD

We are fortunate to have as a member and former board member, one of the top master aircraft mechanics in the nation, Al Schade. Al has had several remarkable careers in aviation for more than 60-years - and that plural is intentional. For over 50 years Al has carried an A&P license, Ground Instructor and Commercial Flight Instructor licenses with instrument and multi-engine ratings in some 50 types of aircraft. He has also served our US military in combat in two wars and been an engineer in aerospace for 32-years.

Al enlisted in the Marine Corps shortly after the bombing of Pearl Harbor and served four years as an aerial gunner and plane captain on the Douglas SBD "Dauntless" aircraft aboard the USS Coral Sea. Assigned to the 1st Marine Air Wings, his first duty was to repair SBDs that had been damaged in the Battle of Midway. Al was discharged from the Marine Corps in 1946. During the years 1946 to 1948, Al flew charter for Kerrville Flying Service in Texas and taught flying. In 1948 Al became a business owner at the Orange County Airport buying surplus military aircraft and converting them for general aviation. He also continued to teach flying. When general aviation took a nosedive in 1950, the business folded and he hired on with North American Aviation. In August 1950 he was recalled into the Marine Corps and spent a year in combat as a fire-team leader in Korea.

In September 1951, Al returned to North American Aviation, Space Division, where he served for 32-years as an engineer in space research and development. During this time, Al was a project engineer on a number of space programs: Navajo, Apollo, Apollo-Soyuz, and the Space Shuttle. He was the responsible project engineer on the Challenger spacecraft, a 10-year exercise, retiring in January 1982. Al continues to fly and repair and refurbish aircraft for our museum. Al will speak about his military service in World War II.







Come into Freedom Hall and check out a new pictorial exhibit of Amelia Earhart. Our thanks to member *June Cunningham* for providing some unique black and white copies of photos taken during 1936-1937 of Amelia Earhart. Amelia visited Cal Poly in 1935 and 1936 to have her aircraft worked on by students and professors from the aeronautical department. Luckily pictures were taken at Cal Poly to record her visit.

We have some great additions to our WW I uniform display, including that of a French soldier. Docent *John Gramentine* has put some unique uniforms, armament and medals on loan to the Museum from his personal collection. Come visit and check this out!

Stroll over by the WW II era British phone booth and see a wonderful 1943 BSA British Army messenger's motorcycle. This is on loan from *Sammy Nemeth* and her family.



THE ANSWERS

Another great name in American automobile racing drove the last roadster to victory at Indianapolis in 1964, the year after Parnelli Jones' win. For the driver, A. J. Foyt, this would be the second of ultimately four victories in the 500, and like Parnelli, he drove a Watson roadster, this time the Sheraton/ Thompson Special powered by the then dominate Offenhauser engine, which ironically would never win again at the Brickyard.

The following year, 1965, one of the greatest drivers who ever lived, Scotland's Jimmy Clark, drove a rear-engined Lotus/Ford to victory and inaugurated the era of rear-engined cars that continues to dominate open-wheeled racing around But, for those of us who remember those sleek Indy roadsters, they continue to be the most beautiful racing



cars ever built. And for those of you who don't follow open-wheel racing, visit Don Woodland's display to see some examples of a by -gone but greatly missed era of American racing. Thanks, Don, for keeping the legend alive!
