
In the restoration building work is moving along on the T-34B and the Aeromachi MB-326. Believe it or not we should have the F-16 by the time this newsletter gets to you. We have been told that it has been de-militarized and they will be taking off the wings and trucking it to us soon.

If you have not heard, for this years Warbirds Wings and Wheels, we will have a drawing for a private tour of 4 people at Jay Leno's Big Dog Garage. His private car collection is not open to the public, so this is a great chance to see it. Tickets are \$5.00 each or 5 for \$20.00. They are on sale at the next 2 Dinner Meetings, at the Gift Shop when we are open, and of course on May 19<sup>th</sup> during the open house and car show.

As I mentioned in February the construction of the Hind Pavilion new entrance to the Museum was started at the beginning of the year, and the structure is up and the exterior windows will be in place the first week of April, making it weather proof. This has been a massive undertaking for the Museum. It started over a year ago when the Hind Foundation said they would help fund the building. The first thing we had to do was change our master plan. A significant problem was we had to re-route the main airport water line that ran between Freedom Hall and the Brooks Building. You can't put a building over a main supply water line because it may have to be repaired some day. When you want to construct a building like this one, that means permits and construction plan reviews. It all takes time. Weather was also a factor that slowed us down.

Unfortunately, the price of materials, etc. has gone up since our original construction cost estimates early in 2011. Between the money that Hind Foundation granted us and the funds we set aside for construction we will have the building up, but we will need money to complete the interior and do some final exterior finish work. For that reason we are going to our membership to ask for donations to complete the building. Letters have been sent. Any contribution will help us to finish the building. It is still possible to complete it by May 19<sup>th</sup>. If you did not get a letter, please contact us if you can make a contribution. All contributions large or small help get the jobdone.



He is a noted public speaker lecturing on aviation safety and archeology to a wide range of audiences. Pat has been the coordinator since 1997 in the search for missing Women Airforce Service Pilot (WASP) Gertrude "Tommy" Tompkins Silver. 


