

Dick and Kenny

Dick Woodland, Kenny Van Blargen, Dan Verstuyft, Darrell Drum and Bob Chute, as moderator, will talk about the early days of racing in the Paso Robles area and what that led to over the years. The racing group will start off speaking about the post WWII time period around 1949. At that time the majority of the people racing, either driving or the builders and mechanics had been in the military service, were just getting used to peacetime and just a bit bored. The Hard-Top/Jalopies type automobile racing was becoming quite popular and it was a relatively inexpensive form of racing. Many towns had a track and nearly every gas station soon had a "race car." Paso Robles and Atascadero were no exception.

Dick Woodland's father owned some very successful early race cars, late 1940s through early 1950s variety, plus he had some of the best drivers of the day. Dick said his dad was much wiser than he and walked away from the sport early on. However, by then dick had the "bug" and wasn't smart enough to quit until age, business, and the financial outlook dictated he should pull the plug in 2008. That capped roughly 50 years of owning race cars, driving them and wrenching them until he fired himself!

Kenny Van Blargen began his racing career in the late 1940s and remained active until his accident at Havasu City left him paralyzed from the waist down. He won hundreds of races throughout California in Jalopies, Modified and Sprint Cars.

Dan Verstuyft and his wife, Carol, are heading up **WARBIRDS**, **WINGS & WHEELS #4**. Dan's background is an engineer and he worked on the NASA space program. He is now involved in racing vintage stock cars (NASCAR type).

Darrell Drum's father was very involved in local auto racing at both the Paso robles Fairgrounds and Atascadero Speedway. Darrell grew up with it and has an interesting insight into the local auto-racing scene.
