A full plate is on tap for the next several months! All please note; due to Independence Day falling on the 1st Wed in July, our dinner meeting is rescheduled for the 2nd Wed, July 11th.

I wish to commend Rob Kinnear for his 2 yrs as President of your Museum. Many great things transpired under his guidance. He has facilitated a dynamic organization. With continued support of the membership we will see even bigger things in the future. Our goal of becoming a premier museum on the Central Coast is not far out of reach. If this statement seems brash to you, I invite you to review in your mind what this organization looked like 5 yrs ago. We have 1/3 again more members, several new buildings with exhibits, projects to occupy the restoration crew for many months, and an Airshow to plan and execute. This will involve an entire new dimension incorporating the Planes of Fame, the premier operator of flying warbirds in the US and probably the world.

The F-16 has the tailcone and "turkey feathers" attached. Except for a few bits and pieces and a general clean-up, it is ready for display. The T-34B Mentor has been painted. It is being assembled by the Restoration Crew and it will look great. The Italian Aermacchi is being clear-coated. It will soon be ready for assembly. With it on display, we will have an "interesting" foreign contingent: a Swedish Lansing (SAAB), a Fouga Magister (French) with Israeli markings and the Aermacchi (Italian-built) with Dutch markings. Eclectic, yes?

Outreach to our community is another ongoing feature of your museum. Recently, we hosted the 2nd Obbie Atkinson Blood Drive. It was a success thanks to our donors. The recent primary election saw us as a polling place for 2 precincts. Long hours that day and many thanks to those who did their duty. You may have noticed some younger folks around the Museum in uniform now and then. We are providing a venue for the local Civil Air Patrol detachment to convene. This s a bit of a two-way street as they get to touch and feel airplanes as part of their syllabus, we derive some labor in return.

The Hind Pavilion is progressing. Presently, electrical conduit followed by sheetrock is in work. Member conations of over \$8000 have helped push this project along. A heartfelt super thank you to all who contributed. We are quite willing to accept further donations, so don't be shy.

Planning for "Warbirds Over Paso" is ramping up. Several critical functional areas which are in immediate need of volunteers have been identified. Volunteers from our ranks are critical if this undertaking is to succeed. So, please consider your willingness to help. We have a need to identify, very quickly by name, volunteers to serve as team leaders for nine different functions. These key functions are (1) Hot Ramp Supervisor (2) Static Ramp Supervisor (3) Parking Lot Team Leader (4) command Post (5) Crowd Line Team Leader (6) Money Room Leader (7) Vendor Team Leader (8) Volunteer Team Leader and (9) Ticket Taker Team Leader. These sound like daunting tasks to start from scratch. The Planes of Fame has been doing this for a long time. They will provide training and will be side by side with our volunteers to assist during the event. This year is a learning experience for us all! JULY PROGRAM

William "Bill" W. Siler

Lt. Colonel, Retired



William "Bill" W. Siler (who turned 96 years old on June 23, 2012) obtained a private pilot's license and then went to Canada and served as a navigator in the Royal Canadian Air Force. Bill had enlisted to serve before Pearl Harbor and Hitler's declaration of war against the United States. He later served in the American Army Air Corps in the European theater as a navigator on B-17s. He was also involved in the Berlin Air Lift in the late 1940's. Bill continued to serve in the Air Force and rose to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

During the Cold War he was employed at the Aeronautical Chart and Information Center in St. Louis, Missouri. This was a time when aeronautical information was at a premium. It was on such a watch that it was revealed that the Soviet Union had placed medium range nuclear missiles in Cuba. Siler and President Kennedy (along with Attorney General Kennedy and other members of the EXCOMM) were able to persuade Premiere Khrushev to withdraw and World War III was averted.

William Wallace Siler was born in Macon County North Carolina on June 23, 1916. His father was Arthur Lee Siler of North Carolina and William was of the sixth generation of the family of Pleikard Dederic Siler who had emigrated to America from Ittlingen, Germany in the year 1738.

William Siler's middle name of Wallace is taken from his mother's maiden name. She had come from Missouri and was a teacher in North Carolina. She was the third wife of Arthur Lee Siler and after his death returned to Mexico, Missouri where Bill spent most of his childhood and early schooling. After graduating from high school, in advance of his age, he attended Westminster College in Fulton, Missouri. He later married Ruth Beard who was a native Fultonian.

Bill retired from active duty in the 1970's but still stays active today in the Sons of the American Revolution and in annual meetings of the Weimar Siler branch in North Carolina of which he is proud to be a member. He runs a mile or so every other day and stays very much in shape both mentally and physically.






AN ACTUAL EXCHANGE BETWEEN PILOT AND CONTROL TOWER


