Our guest speaker for August 1, 2012 is U.S. Army Major Charles E. Jarvis, Battalion Executive Officer, 340th BSB at Camp Roberts. Maj. Jarvis has over 29 years of service in the Army divided up as 11 1/2 years enlisted and 18 years of commissioned service.

Maj. Jarvis joined the U.S. Army in 1983 and repaired tanks for several years. He attended Officer Candidate School (OCS) in 1994 after receiving an AA/General Education degree from Cuesta College in San Luis Obispo. Later he graduated from Regents College in New York with a B.S. in Liberal Arts.






