

Come meet GARY KUHN and hear about the Lockheed U-2 spy plane and its secret flights over many enemy countries during the Cold War.



Gary Kuhn, 72 years old, lives in Atascadero and has been married to his wife, Ruth, for 19 years. He is the father of six children and two step-children. Gary has traveled to many parts of Europe several times and will be going to the Mediterranean Sea for a two week cruise, as well as London, this coming fall. He and his wife toured Russia five years ago and were totally enthralled with what they saw and heard.

Gary is a graduate of Bakersfield High School where he participated in the 1958 California state track meet as a pole-vaulter recording 13 feet. He is a graduate of Cal Poly SLO holding a Masters Degree in Education.

He was a teacher at Atascadero High School where he taught, from 1972 to 2002, a total of 37 years. He taught both English and World History and coached cross-country. (His team won a league championship 9 out of 10 years and was a CIF runner-up one year.) Also, he coached the CIF championship cross-country team, while teaching and coaching, at Rio Mesa High School in Oxnard in 1968.

At Atascadero, he coached Estrella Warbirds Museum board member Dave Highland in the high jump, long jump, 4x100 yard relay, 440 dash and 4x440 yard relay which won the league championship for Atascadero in 1973. Gary will let us know if Dave was "doping" during his high school career and if he is still "high!"

For the past 6 years, Gary has given PowerPoint presentations on both history and his personal travels.

"Their Next Mission"

Local World War II veterans will take to the sky on one more mission. Nearly 65 years after World War II, local veterans will be flying out of San Luis Obispo on April 12, 2013 to Washington, D.C. to see their war memorial that represents the sacrifice that the "Greatest Generation" gave. The WWII memorial wasn't finished until 2004 and many veterans have not had the opportunity or the capability to see the memorial that has been put up in their honor.

In 2005 the organization "Honor Flight" was set up to ensure that WWII veterans can make it to Washington to see their war memorial at no cost to them. The organization has flown over 90,000 veterans since the program started in 2005. In 2012 an Honor Flight hub started in Bakersfield (Honor Flight Kern County) and flew over 100 veterans. Now Honor Flight Kern County is reaching out to central coast veterans. The SLO flight is being put together by Greg McGill, who has been on two previous flights out of Bakersfield, and John Lewis of Templeton.

The veterans will go on the flight with a "guardian" who assists them along the flight. The guardians help the veterans by carrying their luggage, pushing them around the memorials in wheel chairs, taking pictures and helping the veterans with anything they may need. All the guardians are self funded, and go through a short training session to ensure that the veterans have a great trip. This trip will change the lives of the veterans and guardians.

On average the trip cost \$1,500 per vet to go on the trip.
