Lieutenant Colonel Alfred J. Fonzi II, U.S. Army (Ret.)



Al Fonzi, retired since January 2006, was an Army Lieutenant Colonel and intelligence officer with over 36 years of military service which included both enlisted and commissioned service. Since his retirement he has been employed as a consultant for SRI International, an affiliate of Stanford University. He is recognized by the State of California as a specialist in counterterrorism, disaster management and other issues regarding Homeland Security.

Lieutenant Colonel Fonzi's service began in Southeast Asia which included two combat tours in Vietnam, and various assignments throughout the Cold War, including assignment to Army Special Forces. He served in Europe, Korea, the Middle East and the Balkans, to include service in Bosnia as the Chief of Counter-intelligence and HUMINT for the National Intelligence Cell in Sarajevo. During the 1990's, he served as a counternarcotics intelligence officer while assigned to the DEA and FBI in South Central Los Angeles and along the Mexican border. His last combat tour was in Iraq in 2004, from which he was medically evacuated, leading to his retirement. Among his awards are the Combat Action Badge, Parachutist and Aircrew wings.

LTC Fonzi holds multiple earned degrees, to include a Master's Degree in International Relations from the University of Southern California. He is politically active in conservative politics and is a regular columnist for the Atascadero News. He has been married to former Mayor and current City Councilwoman of Atascadero, Roberta Fonzi, since 1974. They have four children, the oldest of whom is also an Iraq combat veteran with the First Marine Division. Al and his wife, Roberta, live in one of the oldest Colony Homes in Atascadero, the upkeep and repair of which keep him challenged daily.





Every year, the Girl Scouts of the Central Coast, California have their Annual Day Camp event and this year's theme was "Night at the Museum". Over a course of 5 days, over 120 young ladies, and some of their parents, got to experience first hand what the numerous museums of our county has to offer.

I was cordially invited to attend a day of this Day Camp as a teacher, and give a presentation to the Scouts on aviation and aircrafts, and the females who paved the way for future aviatrix. In a span of 6 hours, I had the pleasure of speaking with the girls and answering all of their questions about Amelia Earhart and other heroines from history; how they, themselves, would be able to become pilots some day and how our military and aircraft history is important to their generation.

There were 6 groups of Girl Scouts, and each presentation lasted about 35 - 40 minutes. During that time, I spoke to the girls about Harriet Quimby, the first American woman to get her pilot's license; Bessie Coleman, a daredevil pilot and the first African American to get a license to fly; the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) who helped serve during World War II, as well as the assortment of aircrafts we have on display here at the museum (F4 Phantom II, Lockheed F104).

I had a wonderful time speaking with these young ladies and, hopefully, future pilots. Perhaps in these future months, we will see a few of their faces in the museum and will be further inspired by all that we have to show and to teach here.

Any books or materials, checked out, must be returned, before more items can be checked out. However, members may exceed the 30 day check out cycle, by having books or materials re-stamped, with a new due date. There will be a limit to one (1) re-stamp on books or materials.

Books and materials, may be returned to the library, during open hours. There will also be a "return" drop off basket located in the Gift Shop and at Thomson Hall (during the Dinner meetings).
