Lt. Col. Wayne Rice USMC (Retired)

Past Estrella Warbirds Museum President



Determined to follow a career in aviation Wayne elected to join the Marine Corps Platoon Leaders Course (aviation) while a junior in college. Subsequently, he attended 10 weeks of Officer Training at Quantico, Virginia in the summer of 1965 and, upon graduation from UCSB in 1966, received a commission as a Second Lieutenant and proceeded to Pensacola, Florida for flight training. After graduating from flight school in January 1968 he received orders to El Toro, California and started training in the F-4 Phantom.

His squadron deployed from El Toro in the early spring of 1969 to Chu Lai Vietnam where he flew in excess of 100 missions earning 8 Air Medals and the Distinguished Flying Cross. In the fall of 1969, the North Koreans captured the USS Pueblo and the situation on the Korean peninsula deteriorated. As a result of this, the squadron was redeployed to Iwakuni, Japan in anticipation of further action in northeastern Asia.

Wayne elected to remain in the Marine Corps and attained a regular commission. Subsequently he was selected for TOPGUN and served as a weapons instructor in the F-4 for several different squadrons. Assignments also included Operations Officer for two squadrons and Executive Officer for VMFA-333, the source of the museum's F-4. The last four years of duty involved contingency planning assignments for operations in NATO, Central America and the Middle East.

Following military retirement Wayne spent 18 years flying for various charter passenger and freight airlines attaining type-ratings in the Boeing 727, 737, 757 and 767, and served as a Check Airman in the B-727. While with MGM Grand Air he flew for several NBA, NHL and major league baseball teams as well as sundry rock groups. In 1995 he was one of the principal Captains for the Dole Presidential campaign.

Wayne married Marcia in 1967 after her graduation from UCSB. They have one daughter who, with her husband and new granddaughter reside in Castle Rock, Colorado. The Rice's became part of the North County when they purchased their land in 1995 and then moved from Orange County in 2004 when Marcia retired from UCI.


