


D. Kenneth Richardson Biography November 2013

Ken Richardson retired in 1991 as President and Chief Operating Officer of Hughes Aircraft Company. He served for forty years in key technical and management positions. As President, Richardson directed the operations of 80,000 employees with 12,000 products and annual sales over \$12 billion. This aerospace firm was one of the top ten US defense contractors, ranked world-first in military electronics, and was the largest private employer in California and in Arizona. Major products were radars, guided missiles, electro-optical sensors, computers, displays, and training devices. Also remarkable was its being the world's leading developer, producer, and operator of satellite systems.

Richardson received a BS in Mechanical Engineering magna cum laude from Tufts University, an MSME cum laude from USC, an MBA from UCLA, and the UCLA Executive Program Certificate. He has received many public honors and awards, including Alumnus of the Year from three Universities. He has been on the Tufts board of trustees and five charitable organizations, and wrote Hughes After Howard The Story of Hughes Aircraft Company (website hughesafterhoward.com).

Ken resides with his wife Charlotte in Santa Barbara, California. He was born in Hawaii, raised two sons and enjoys four grandchildren. A diverse recreational life included competitive football and swimming, surfing, scuba diving, backpacking, yacht sailing, private flying, and world travel.





Ken is no stranger to our museum. He first visited us in 2006 as construction began on the Museum building, donating toward our finish of this building. Later he acquired many of our missiles for us. Ken's book "Hughes After Howard: The Story of Hughes Aircraft Company" is on sale in our gift shop.

For our dinner, he will talk about "A Child's View of the 1941 Attack on Pearl Harbor."



Many believe this is what sold Carrol Shelby on the concept of a light weight sports car chassis with a large and powerful American V-8 engine. He went to the drawing boards and shortly after, the Shelby Cobra was a reality.
