



Come meet Lt. Commander Paul "CJ" Oyler Navy Reservist



Lieutenant Commander Paul "CJ" Oyler is a Navy Reservist. He serves with Strike Fighter Squadron 122 (VFA-122) at Naval Air Station Lemoore (NAS), California as an instructor pilot. Outside of the Navy, Paul teaches pre-algebra to eighth grade students at Flamson Middle School.

Paul was born and raised on the central coast of California. Through most of his childhood, Paul's family lived in a house just a few miles from the Paso Robles Municipal Airport. Paul caught the flying bug early. His uncle, a Lockheed engineer, built a Skybolt biplane from a kit and took Paul for rides every once in a while. Paul spent countless afternoons as a boy riding his bike around the hangars, watching pilots, planes and skydivers. He graduated from Paso Robles High School, where he met his future wife, in 1998.

Paul attended the United States Naval Academy and competed on the midshipmen's varsity lightweight crew team. He majored in economics and minored in Spanish. He was commissioned in May 2002.

Paul received orders to flight training at NAS Pensacola, Florida. His first formal flying instruction was conducted in T-34C Turbomentor aircraft at NAS Whiting Field in Milton, Florida. After primary flight training, he completed advanced training in the T-45 Goshawk at NAS Kingsville, Texas. Paul earned his Navy wings of gold in 2004.

Following flight school, then LTJG Oyler learned to fly the F/A-18 Hornet with VFA-125 at NAS Lemoore. He reported to the "Gunslingers" of VFA-105 at NAS Oceana, Virginia. As a Gunslinger, Paul transitioned from the Hornet (F/A-18C) to the Super Hornet (F/A-18E) and deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom aboard USS HARRY S TRUMAN (CVN-75).

Paul was selected to attend the Navy's TOPGUN school and earned his Strike Fighter Tactics Instructor (SFTI) qualification in September 2008. He then served as an instructor at Strike Fighter Weapons School, Pacific, where he flew every variant of the F/A-18, the T-34C and E/A-18G and led a team of 24 tactical experts.

Paul was subsequently ordered to join the Golden Dragons of VFA-192, who had recently been reassigned to NAS Lemoore. Paul completed one and a half deployments with VFA-192 aboard USS JOHN C STENNIS (CVN-74) flying the F/A-18C Hornet in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation New Dawn.

Paul and his wife, Elizabeth, returned to Paso Robles after leaving active duty service. They have two sons.


