They heard that one of Rich's Midget race cars, built by Rich and his father, Don, was restored and on display at the EWM/Woodland Auto Display. Rich's mother had traveled from Illinois to visit family members in Newport Beach. The family made the trip to Paso Robles to see the famous #2 Volkswagon powered race car.

Rich Vogler, aka Mad Dog, was second in wins, only to AJ Foyt, in the United States Auto Club with 170 plus. He amassed numerous Midget & Sprint Car championships. In addition, he won over 200 races in various other racing organizations. Rich was killed in a Sprint Car racing accident in Salem, Indiana in 1990 while leading the race on the last lap of the event.
