The Akaflieg

Jennifer is a third-year aerospace engineering student at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. Jenn has devoted countless hours over the last seven years to the warbird restoration and education projects at the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) in Camarillo, California. After working with Akaflieg München last summer, Jenn was inspired by the Akaflieg flying club model. She has since devoted her time outside of school to making flying more accessible by growing the SLO Akaflieg and working to attain her CFIG (Certified Flight Instructor-Gliders) rating.

Troy is a fourth-year aerospace engineering student at Cal Poly SLO. He transferred to Cal Poly after two years at Antelope Valley Community College. After discontinuing powered flight training for financial reasons, he is now flying gliders with CCSC (Central California Soaring Club). Troy aims to get his Certified Flight Instructor-Glider rating in order provide free instruction, making aviation accessible to local students who share his passion for flying. After graduation, Troy hopes to work in the aerospace industry to develop more efficient aircraft, and to continue introducing young people to the joys of flight.

The Akafliegs (Academic Flying Clubs) are a collection of ten engineering student-operated glider clubs based in Germany. The clubs provide opportunities for flight training and engineering projects to students of their partner universities. Akaflieg students design, build, and fly experimental gliders. A group of Cal Poly Aerospace Engineering students have organized to implement the first U.S Akaflieg, in partnership with Akaflieg München. This is an awesome opportunity to get students involved in design projects, and low cost flight training in San Luis Obispo County. The Akaflieg San Luis Obispo is currently working on getting a winch operational for flight training.






General Atomics Gnat—750, predecessor to "Predator" drone on the hangar floor is now proudly hanging above our restoration crew!


